'Jay wrestlers miss state title by 1 1/2 points

Smith Center, Beloit tie for crown with 116.5 points, Norton gets 115

After winning the last three Class 3-2-1A state championships in a row, head coach Bill Johnson's Norton Community High School wrestling team's dream of a fourth straight missed the mark by just one and one-half points as they finished third in the "big show" over the weekend in Gross Memorial Coliseum in Hays.

Smith Center, who placed second 76.5 points behind Norton last year, tied for this year's state championship with Beloit, who placed eighth a year ago.

Norton had the championship sewed up by the end of the first day a year ago, but this time around it was obvious that it was a much tighter team race. After the first two rounds on Friday, Norton led with 57 points, Beloit was second with 51.5 and Smith Center third with 46. By the end of the day, the Redmen had moved into the lead with 85 points, followed by Beloit, 74.5 and Norton, 72.

Norton qualified 10 wrestlers and still had nine left. Beloit and Smith Center each had seven left. Norton had one wrestler in the finals, Beloit had two and Smith Center had three.

After two consolation rounds on Saturday, Norton and Smith Center were tied for the lead with 109 points and Beloit had dropped to third with 103.5. After the third and fifth place matches with just the championship finals remaining, Beloit had surged into first with 112.5 points and Norton and Smith Center were tied for second

Each of the three schools had one state champion but Smith Center's gold medal winner had a technical fall which accounted for enough extra points to move the Redmen into a 116.5 tie with the Trojans for the state championship. The Blue Jays' extra four points for a champion made their final total 115.

This was one of the closest finishes ever for a Class 3-2-1A state tournament. The only other tie for St. Francis and Leoti in 1996.

Fourth place went to an excellent Scott City team, who has always performed well in the Class 4A state tournament but moved down to 3Athis year. The Beavers scored 97 points.

Phillipsburg made it three Mid-Continent League teams in the top five with their 85 points. They were followed by Eureka, 83; Sabetha, 73.5; Oakley, 67; St. Francis, 64; and Silver Lake, 63.5 to round out the top 10. Other teams of interest and their placing were: Plainville, 38, 14th; Oberlin, 35, 15th; Atwood, 17, tie for 17th; Trego, 29.5, 19th; Osborne, 29, 20th; Stockton, 22, 28th; Ellis, 17, tie for 31st and Hill City, 15.5,

A total of 224 wrestlers who four regional tournaments competed and a total of 84 different schools were represented.

Only four of Norton's 10 state qualifiers had previous state tournament experience and seven Blue Jay wrestlers placed, more than any other school. Smith Center and Beloit placed six wrestlers each and Scott City had five plac-


