Blue Jays fall to Panthers in substate semis

Coach Doug Reusink's Norton Community High School No.2 seeded boys basketball team played their second close, hardfought game of the season with rival Phillipsburg, the No.3 seed, in the semi-finals of the Class 3A Substate Tournament on Friday night in Phillipsburg, but this time the Panthers came out on top 58-52 to end the Blue Jays' season.

In the Mid-Continent League opener on Friday, Dec. 15 in Norton, the Blue Jays won a very closely contested game 40-31 by hitting free throws at the end.

The Panthers, who are coached by Keith Sides, a former Northern Valley player who played for coach Reusink, are the ones who hit their free throws this time around to win the game. Phillipsburg hit 10 of 12 free throws in the fourth quarter and only two baskets.

The Blue Jays outscored the Panthers 18-14 in the final stanza but it wasn't enough to make up for a 44-34 deficit after three quarters. Norton hit 9 field goals and had no free throws in the fourth quarter.

Norton scored 34 points in the paint during the game, with most of them coming from senior forward Nic Lewis, who poured in 24, and the rest from junior forward Wes Georgeson, with 6, and senior post Blake Wolf and junior forward Preston Herman, with 2

Senior guard Jared Engelbert ended with 11, junior point guard Logan Kats with 5 and senior guard Brian Juenemann with 2.

The Newlin Gym was filled to nearly capacity by fans and bands from both towns. Although first quarter, the Panthers grabbed a 13-10 lead by the end of the period and led the rest of the way. Norton trailed 35-24 at halftime.

The Blue Jays quickly made up

some of their 10 point deficit entering the fourth quarter when Kats fired a long pass to Lewis and he scored, then Georgeson intercepted a Phillipsburg pass and scored to make it a six-point game at 44-38 with 6:44 remaining. Former Norton wrestler qualifies for nationals

James Annon, 141 pound sophomore from Norton at Fort Hays State University, placed second in his weight class in the West Regional/Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference wrestling championship last Sunday in Golden, Colo., and qualified for the NCAA Division II national tournament in Kearney, Neb. March 9-10.

Annon was one of seven wrestlers from the No.9 nationally ranked Tiger squad to qualify for the national tournament by placing in the top four in their weight classes.

Annon was the No.5 seed at 141 pounds. He first defeated No.4 seed Chris Freije, Western State, 8-5, then decisioned Cody Weitzel, Colorado Mines, 7-2, to reach the championship finals. He wrestled No.2 seed Ross Montour, News Mexico Highlands, and lost Phillipsburg was senior Jonathan Feik. Partially hidden was a 16-8 decision to place second.

only other Tiger to qualify for the championship finals but did not

wrestle in the finals. Third place finishers for Fort Hays were Danny Grater, 157 and Tyler Gonzales, 197. Finishing fourth were Derek Patterson, 133; Mikel Delk, 149 and Mike Howell, 184.

Nebraska-Kearney won the regional and RMAC Championship with 141.5 points and Fort Hays was second with 109.5. The Lopers are ranked No.1 in the nation.

Annon is now 16-10 for the season. He wrestled earlier in the season at 133 pounds. He was a threetime state placer and two-time state champion for the Norton Blue Jays. His career record was 128-23.

He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Bob Annon, Norton.
