Survey crew working on US 36


AKansas Department of Transable federal funding. portation survey crew has started working on U.S. 36 from the east side of Norton to the junction of K-383, six miles east.

A spokesperson for the department, Kristen Brands, said this section of the highway is being considered for surface rehabilitation. It has not been selected for construction, but is in a pool of candidate projects being developed for construction, if funding permits, after the landowner or tenant. the Comprehensive Transportation would be selected based on avail- 785-877-3315.

Mrs. Brands said survey activities will include the use of survey instruments on the ground to determine locations of existing features within the survey corridor. She said the crew might place plastic "targets" on the ground for aerial photo identification. If it becomes necessary for crew members to enter private property, they will, first, obtain permission from
