Norton track team competes at Lexington, Phillipsburg

The Norton Community High School girls and boys track teams split into three groups to compete on Friday and Saturday.

Most of the varsity competed in the Lexington "Don Bader" Invitational on Friday afternoon. Junior varsity team members, except for javelin throwers, were contestants in the Phillipsburg Invitational on Friday afternoon. Senior Blake VanEaton, junior Courtney LeClair and sophomores Laura Lee Baird and Hayli Bozarth competed in the 80th annual Kansas Relays at the University of Kansas on Friday and Saturday.

"April 20 and 21 were extremely busy for us as we were spread thin, competing in three different meets," said Norton head coach Jason Jones.

"Success was not to be measured in team scores but rather in levels of competitiveness and in individual event and relay performances.

"Our junior varsity team and some varsity throwers traveled to Phillipsburg for their invitational meet. We competed very well against what was, for us, a highly competitive field. Some of our athletes had not seen a meet in a couple of weeks so it was great for them to get a chance to compete again.

"Our varsity and non-javelin throwers went to Lexington, Neb. to battle it out with some very large and successful teams who we don't get to see regularly. No team scores were kept so we were looking to step in and compete with hopes of bettering our performances and that happened in many cases. It was a very windy meet and the meet was cut short due to weather but it was good for our girls and boys to see some new competition and we grew as a result of this meet.

"Hayli Bozarth, Laura Lee Baird, Courtney LeClair and Blake VanEaton headed to Lawrence to compete in the Kansas Relays, a multi-level meet that accepts a limited number of entries coming in from any school within 500 miles of Lawrence.
