Norton County 4-H shooters do well at state

BB gun team wins championship


Members of the Norton County Rotary BB Gun Team entered the Kansas State 4-H Shoot in Great Bend on Saturday, April 21 and won the state championship for the second week in a row.

The same young marksmen competed the Saturday before in the Kansas Jaycees State BB Gun Championships in Manhattan and earned the state championship and a trip to Bowling Green, Ky., June 29-July 1 to compete in the Daisy/ Jaycees International BB Gun Championships.

Competing in the 4-H state only. shoot were Cole Archer, Kegan Vanover, Lane Archer, Kaitlyn Norton shooter, recording a 373 x Campbell and Lane Vanover. Lane Vanover shot as an alternate in the state Jaycees shoot but replaced Cristine Nelson at the 4-H shoot since she had another commitment.

The Norton team placed first ahead of the Pottawatomie/Riley County team for the second week in a row.

No written test on gun safety knowledge was held; all scores were based on shooting accuracy

'We have a strong team of shooters," said Norton head coach Cameron Archer. "Some individuals do especially well in certain positions but the team as a whole is strong in every position.

Barebow

In barebow as a team, Kerby Brandyberry, Chase Braun, Dana Hillebrand and Diedre Kramer scored a total of 781 points, putting them above Gray County's 621.

Individually, Austin Hager grabbed first in the Junior 3D division with 117 points. Marc Miller, Kegan Vanover and Shelbi McKenna also scored in the division with Miller placing fourth with 82 points; Vanover taking fifth with 78 points, and McKenna taking 10th with 66 points.



The team of Chase Braun, Carson Braun, Kyle Edgett and Dana Hillebrand racked up 1432 points in the open team division, following closely behind Butler County with 1450 and Barton County with 1439.

Individually, Austin Hager took second in both the Junior 3D and Junior FITA divisions for a second place overall ranking. He scored 131 points in 3D and 203 in FITA for a total of 334. He was the only junior competitor from Norton County who placed in the top ten.

In the senior division, Kyle points to take first overall in the division with 405 points. Chase Braun took fifth in Senior 3D with 167 points and eighth in the Senior FITA with 204 points to place sixth overall with 371. Carson Braun was right behind him, placing seventh overall with 367 points after taking sixth in FITA. He scored 153 points in 3D, but didn't place in the top 10.
