Former Norton teacher to celebrate 90 years

Creta Mapes, Norton, will celebrate her 90th birthday Monday, May 14. Her husband, Loyal Mapes, would like to honor her with a card shower. Birthday greetings will reach Mrs. Mapes at 801 N. Archer, Norton, Kan. 67654.

Mrs. Mapes was born May 14, 1917, in Almema.

As a young woman she became a teacher. Her first job was in a one-room country school a few miles northeast of Almema. She was paid \$35 a month. Out of that she had to pay \$12 a month for room and board at a rural home near the school. As the teacher, she was expected to carry the daily supply of drinking water for the students; sweep and clean the schoolhouse; get to school early enough to start the fire in the heating stove; carry out the ashes; and keep a large kettle of water on

the stove to cook hot meals like beans or stew.

Later, she and Audrey Reedy taught at Calvert where they had all eight grades. Each woman taught four grades. They taught there several years before moving into Norton where they taught for a few years at the old school house that stands where the new library is located. After Eisenhower Elementary School was built she spent the rest of her teaching career there.

She spent 45 years of her life teaching school in Norton County.

Her husband said, "Whenever we go out, someone will come to Creta and ask her if she remembers them. They will say, 'You were my second grade teacher' or something like that." Some of them she remembers, he said.

Lillian White Flynn, 89, a resident of Norton from 1946 to 1976, died Nov. 28, 2006, at her home in Loveland, Colo.

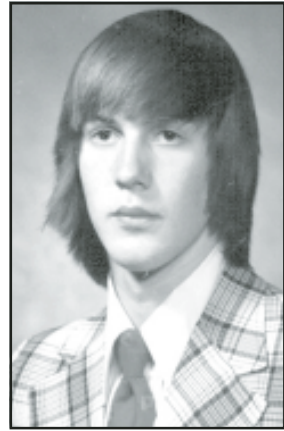
Private family services were held April 30 at the Congregational Church, Almema, with

Olliff-Boeve Memorial Chapel handled the arrangements.


