"Married to Adventure" recounts the world travels of Martin and Osa Johnson as illustrated by their photographs and writings.

Today people are accustomed to the easy availability of television nature programs. Improved sound equipment and cameras with zoom and telephoto lenses make this possible. However, Martin's ability to photograph and develop his own film in the field made him a master of working in primitive conditions. The word "close-up" for the Johnson's was certainly an accurate description. They often found themselves in dangerous situations when approaching wild animals on foot or by open car.

Martin and Osa's bravery with the camera led to some unforgettable film sequences, but it wasn't all drama and high adventure in the jungles or on the plains. The frus-

trating reality of photography in the early 20th century consisted of enormously cumbersome and equally fragile equipment that required vast quantities of chemicals to be transported and stored in climates that often made running a proper darkroom near impossible. Martin tried to distance himself from others of the time, such as Frank Buck who mainly filmed captive animals and fight sequences using various improbable antagonists. On the silver screen, and later in one of the first nature shows on television, the Johnson's popularized camera safaris and spawned an interest in wildlife conservation for generations of Americans.

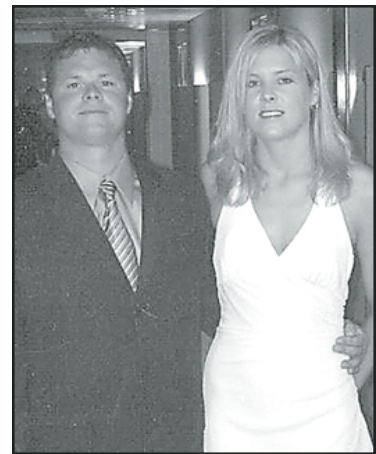
Norton girl set to wed June 9
