Martin tried to distance himself from others of the time, such as Frank Buck who mainly filmed captive animals and fight sequences using various improbable antagonists. On the silver screen, and later in one of the first nature shows on television, the Johnson's popularized camera safaris and spawned an interest in wildlife conservation for generations of Americans.




