If someone shows signs of heat exhaustion, get them out of the sun and into a cool or air-conditioned location. Lay the person down and elevate the legs and feet slightly. Cool the person down by spraying or sponging them with cool water. Let them drink cool water or a sports drink that contains electrolytes. 
