said. The goal is based on county size and what the county has raised in the past.

The money, she said, is used to pay for the mission of the American Cancer Society — "Reason to Relay: Research, Education, Advocacy and Services." About sixty-one percent goes to research; 20 percent to education, advocacy and services; 15 percent to help pay for fund raising; and 4 percent to administration costs.

She said from Sept. 1 to March 31, 22 Norton County residents have received American Cancer Society Services.

Mrs. Ballinger said people who want to help can make donations, buy luminaria, participate in the drawing or they can just come and watch and applaud the survivors for what they've achieved.

Mrs. Durham said there are 13

teams participating — Eagles Auxiliary, Developmental Services of Northwest Kansas, Andbe Home, Eisenhower Elementary, Second Chance Homeless Pet Society, PEO, Nex-Tech, two Norton County Hospital teams, and four student teams from the Norton Community High School.
