A new Kansas license plate for breast cancer research and outreach, should begin showing up on Kansas vehicles starting in January 2008, thanks to a bill signed into law by Gov. Kathleen Sebelius on April 1 of this year.

According to information provided by Rita Speer, R.N., M.S., Norton, who is a breast cancer survivor, individuals who want to have this license plate will have to pay a \$50 tax-deductible donation. The money will support the University of Kansas Cancer Center's clinical trial program.
