Dorothy (Roeder) Bernard was born July 13, 1917 in Grant Township, Norton County, to Fred and Lottie (Pratt) Roeder. Her siblings were Wilda (Roeder) Van Patten, Orville Roeder, Mildred "Milly" (Roeder) Scott Chartier, Cecil Roeder and two brothers who died in infancy. Shortly after her birth, the

family moved to Belle Plaine township where they lived until about 1940. The family lived on a farm and Dorothy helped with chores. She milked cows, worked in the garden, fed hogs, helped her mother can produce from the garden and brought in corn cobs and wood for the cast iron stove her mother cooked on. A big job for farm women back then was cooking for the harvest crews. She said they began cooking first thing in the morning, even making their own noodles.

It wasn't all work. Dorothy said there would be dances held in neighbor's barns or in a school house. She said she loved to dance and learned how to polka and waltz. Dorothy attended the Belle

Plaine country school through eighth grade, and Almena High School for two years. She said

she wanted to go to high school in Norton, but her parents wouldn't allow it, so she quit school.

She married Eldred "Frecks"

Vance on Sept. 17, 1939. Two children were born to this union: Ernest Vance, Sacramento, Calif., and Charlotte (Vance) Keiswetter, Great Bend. When their son, Ernest, was

only two years old, he contracted polio. Dorothy said she had to do everything for him, but he weathered the illness, even though he had to wear special shoes for years. Her eyes filled with tears as she told of the surgery he had to endure, at age 12, to lengthen one of his legs Her husband died Jan. 7, 1947

as the result of injuries sustained in a farming accident. A tractor he was driving upset with him.

To support her children following her husband's death, Dorothy and her children lived with her sister, Wilda and family in Boise, Idaho, while she

attended beauty school. After obtaining her Kansas cosmetology license, she opened Dorothy's Beauty Shop in WaKeeney.

Soon a man began calling on her, and on May 19, 1951, in WaKeeney, she married Homer Bernard. Dorothy sold her beauty shop and moved with him to Densmore where she lived for 52 years. They becane the parents of three children: Ardie (Bernard) Grimes, Baldwin City; Beth (Bernard) Metcalf, Liberal; and Ed Bernard, Wellington. Homer died May 28,1996. While in Densmore, besides

being a wife, homemaker. mother and seamstress, Dorothy pumped gas and kept the books for Densmore Garage. She was involved in 4-H, Parent-Teacher Association, Boy Scouts, American Legion Auxiliary and Rural Letter Carriers Auxiliary.

Dorothy had a stroke several years ago, but tries not to let it slow her down. She works crossword puzzles and enjoys watching birds that gather at the feeders outside her window.

In November 2003, Dorothy moved to Whispering Pines Retirement Center. She keeps busy baking cookies and sewing, including making turbans for cancer patients. She also enjoys traveling to see her family and having them visit her. She said her family is her greatest joy and proudly showed pictures of her children, nine grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.




