Distribution will begin at 9:30 a.m., Saturday, July 28 at the Norton Senior Center.

The July Prairie Pak contains 1 pound of deli cooked ham, 1 pound of unbreaded flounder filets, 18 ounces of pork sirloin chops, 4, 5 ounces of chicken cordon bleu, 1 pound of boneless skinless chicken breasts, 1 pound of bacon plus 6 to 8 different fresh fruits and vegetables.

The July Prairie Pak may be purchased for two hours of volun-

teer work plus \$20.50. A Prairie Pak must be purchased before buying additional packages.

A meat only package (the first six items in the Prairie Pak) costs one additional hour of service and \$12.

There are three separate July Specials.

Special No. 1 may be purchased for one additional volunteer and \$17. It contains 4, 6 ounce sirloin steaks, 4, 4 ounce ground beef patties, 1 pound of chicken breasts and 4, 4 ounce boneless pork chops.

Special No. 2 costs \$15 and one additional hour of volunteer service. It contains an 8 pound box of baby back ribs that are great for the grill.

Special No. 3 is called the "sirloin burger blowout" and it may be purchased for \$12 plus one more

hour of volunteer service. It contains a 5 pound box of 1/2 pound ground sirloin burgers. Each burger is individually wrapped.

During the month of July, each Prairie Pak ordered enters you into a drawing to win two adult passes to Wild West World or one August Prairie Pak and an August Special of your choice.

## Special Educator Services Available at Area School Districts

### SPECIAL EDUCATION INFORMATION FOR THE NORTH CENTRAL KANSAS SPECIAL EDUCATION COOPERATIVE INTERLOCAL #636 (NCKSEC)

Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act of 2004 was reauthorized by Congress and signed by President Bush on December 3, 2004. The legislation basically amended the 1997 IDEA that was the cornerstone of federally mandated services for disabled students. Special education categorical areas include autism, deaf-blindness, deafness, hearing impairment, mental retardation, multiple disabilities, orthopedic impairment, other health impairment, emotional disturbance, specific learning disability, speech or language impairment, traumatic brain injury, visual impairment and blindness, early childhood disabilities and gifted.

The Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act provides for a free, appropriate public education for all disabled students. The foundation of IDEA is its requirement that schools develop an Individualized Education Program (IEP) for each disabled student. The IEP requirement combines the evaluation of disabled students with the achievement of specific goals. These goals are typically set by the student's parents, school administrators, and regular and special education teachers working together.

The North Central Kansas Special Education Cooperative Interlocal #636 will continue to provide special education programs and services to all exceptional children. The NCKSEC consists of thirteen Unified School Districts as follow: #211-Norton, #212-

Northern Valley, #213-Lenora, #237-Smith Center, #238-Kensington, #269-Palco, #270-Plainville, #271-Stockton, #324-Eastern Heights, #325-Phillipsburg, #326-Logan, #392-Osborne, and #399-Natoma.

The purpose of the NCKSEC is to identify all students in the thirteen participating districts who are eligible for and need special education services. Special programs and services are then provided to assist these students in reaching their potential. All these services must meet the requirements and specifications stated in federal and state statutes and further clarified in the Kansas Special Education Process Handbook. Additionally, the NCKSEC must make assurances in the provision of these services. These assurances include confidentiality of student records, provision of students' and parents' due process rights, nondiscriminatory and multi-disciplinary evaluations, and provision of services in the least restrictive environment or most normal setting to the maximum extent appropriate.
