

INCORPORATING STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating traffic within the corporate limits of the City of Lenora, Kansas, that certain standard traffic ordinance known as the "Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities," Edition of 2007, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka.
