## Local student completes astronaut training

HUTCHINSON — The Kansas Cosmosphere and Space Center graduated Julia Kent, daughter of Ron and Nancy Kent, Norton, from level 1 of its Future Astronaut Training Program this summer.

Julia, 12, is a seventh grader at Norton Junior High where she said her favorite subjects are science and art.

She said the camp was lots of fun. Besides making and shooting off rockets she said she made lots of new friends from among the 18 other students, grades 7 to 10 who attended the camp.

The week-long introductory astronaut camp emphasizes teamwork, leadership and problem

solving. Developed by Cosmosphere staff, it is a nationally-recognized camp that motivates campers to seek careers in space-related industries.

During the week, campers test camp simulators — the centrifuge, multi-axis trainer, space shuttle simulator ("Falcon III"), Manned Maneuvering Unit and stress simulator — and launch homemade rockets, direct a robotic mission and learn solar observation techniques.

Julia said the camp made her think she might like to work in a science field in the future. She said she might want to become an astronaut.

### Lenora Ordinance Incorporating the Standard Traffic Ordinance

**ORDINANCE NO. 335**  
AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF LENORA, KANSAS; INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE "STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE FOR KANSAS CITIES," EDITION OF 2007, PROVIDING CERTAIN PENALTIES AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NUMBER 331.

Be it Ordained by the Governing Body of the City of Lenora, Kansas

**SECTION 1. INCORPORATING STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE.** There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating traffic within the corporate limits of the City of Lenora, Kansas, that certain standard traffic ordinance known as the "Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities," Edition of 2007, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka. No fewer than two copies of said Standard Traffic Ordinance shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 335," and to which shall be attached a copy of this ordinance, and filed with the city clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable hours. The police department, municipal judge and all administrative departments of the city charged with enforcement of the ordinance shall be supplied, at the cost of the city, such number of official copies of such Standard Traffic Ordinance similarly marked, as may be deemed expedient.

**SECTION 2. TRAFFIC INFRACTIONS AND TRAFFIC OFFENSES.**

(a) An ordinance traffic infraction is a violation of any section of this ordinance that prescribes or requires the same behavior as that is prescribed or required by a statutory provision that is classified as traffic infraction in K.S.A. 8-2118.

(b) All traffic violations which are included within this ordinance, and which are not ordinance traffic infractions, as defined in subsection (a) of this section, shall be considered traffic offenses.

**SECTION 3. PENALTY FOR SCHEDULED FINES.** The fine for violation of an ordinance traffic infraction or any other traffic offense for which the municipal judge establishes a fine in a fine schedule shall not be less than \$1.00 nor more than \$500.00, except for speeding which shall not be less than \$20.00 nor more than \$500.00. A person tried and convicted for violation of an ordinance traffic infraction or other traffic offense for which a fine has been established in a schedule of fines shall pay a fine fixed by the court not to exceed \$500.

**SECTION 4. REPEAL.** Ordinance number 331 is repealed.

**SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official city newspaper.

**ORDINANCE NO. 334**  
AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PUBLIC OFFENSES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF LENORA, KANSAS; INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE "UNIFORM PUBLIC OFFENSE CODE FOR KANSAS CITIES," EDITION 2007

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF LENORA, KANSAS:

**SECTION 1: INCORPORATING UNIFORM PUBLIC OFFENSE CODE.** There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating public offenses within the City of Lenora, Kansas that certain code known as the "Uniform Public Offense Code" Edition 2007, prepared and published by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas. No fewer than two copies of said Uniform Public Offense Code will be marked or stamped "Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 334," and to which shall be attached a copy of this ordinance, and filed with the city clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable hours.

**SECTION 2: AMENDMENT.** Section 1 of Ordinance 332 is hereby amended and replaced by Section 1 of this

ordinance.  
**SECTION 3: EFFECTIVE DATE.** This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official city newspaper.
