Huskies bring home first win

The recipe called for a teaspoon of patience, a good helping of enthusiasm, and peppered with confidence. Cook slowly on medium heat on opponents grill. Done when buzzer sounds.

This was the recipe for a football victory — a victory chalked up by coach Chuck Fessenden's Northern Valley Huskies over Cheylin at Bird City Friday night.

The scoreboard was correct. The Huskies 26 and Cheylin 6 — the first win of the season for the visiting Huskies who took the field with an 0-4 mark.

Comedian Jackie Gleason often said on his weekly Saturday night television show, "How sweet it is!" That same comment can be made for the Northern Valley Huskies and their loyal following.

The Huskies rolled up 200 yards on the ground vs. 162 for Cheylin. However, the hosts tacked on 62 yards in the air, while the Huskies had no success up there. Total offense, then, was 200 yards Huskies, 224 Cheylin.

But the numbers that counted when the game ended were the numbers on the scoreboard: 26-6 Huskies!

Northern Valley scored 6 points in the first quarter, 12 in the second and 8 in the third. Cheylin managed 6 points in the second.

brought the crowd to its feet when he returned a kick off 77 yards to paydirt in the second quarter. The PAT run failed.

Justin Jeffries also brought the crowd out of its comfort zone with a 53-yard TD run. The PAT run failed. That, too, was in the second quarter.

Brian Sproul brought the fans back up to their feet with a 34-yard run in the third quarter for a TD. Jeffries ran the 2-point conversion.

Jacob Gallentine scored Northern Valley's first TD in the first quarter on a 3-yard run. The PAT failed.

Jacob White scored Cheylin's lone 6-pointer in the second quarter.

The performance of the Northern Valley Husky volleyball varsity team in the Ellis tourney last week, prompted this comment from coach Chuck Zimmerman: "Going into the Ellis tournament we had high hopes of doing well based on our last performance. But it didn't happen. Maybe it was the early start time (after a long away game on Friday) (by the way, congratulations gentlemen) or maybe it was the week and a half lay-off. Whatever it was we came out flat and stayed flat the whole day."

Against Ellis, the Huskies allowed them to "have all the fun by free balling their attacks back to them so they could hit it to us again, and again until we didn't return it and they scored points, 9-25, 16-25," Zimmerman said..

"Our next opponent was Triplains, a team with equal talent as us but we made too many service errors both on our serving and our receiving of their serves. Final scores 21-25, 24-26. We will have a rematch with the Vikings as we play them in our next date at Rexford," the coach said.

"Since we lost two we were then out of the tournament and played our last match against Victoria for pride," he said.

Zimmerman said the girls did show a little pride, and heart as they did win the first game 26-24 while battling all the way and even had to come from behind.

He said the junior varsity was inserted into the second game as a reward for their hard work in practice and played tough against their varsity but was defeated, 4-25.

This set up the final game with the winner leaving the gym smiling.

"We started off strong and got off to a quick 5-0 lead, but the Victoria team came fighting back to tie the game at 7 all and went ahead 12-11," he said.

The Huskies sought to stay in the game and went on a tear to finish "smiling" by the score of 25-16.

The coach summed it up this way: "A satisfying victory, but, a disappointing day. This sport of volleyball is very temperamental and to play it and be successful time in

and time out you must become tough minded and play with an attitude of never letting the opponent have the emotional edge and that you will do whatever it takes, on the floor, to keep the momentum on your side of the net.

"We have not learned to do this yet, but, when they do, as I have said, they will be tough to beat." -td

Jay runners take crown

The Norton Community High School boys cross country team repeated as the champions, and the Lady Jays placed second in the 40th annual Oberlin Invitational cross country meet last Tuesday in Oberlin.

The Blue Jay boys scored 33 points, followed by Colby, 60; Quinter, 83; Wheatland, 103; Oberlin, 124; Goodland, 128; Phillipsburg, 170.

The Colby girls were the champions with 36 points, followed by Norton, 59; Hoxie, 59; Oakley, 112; Oberlin, 118; SouthWest, 119.

BOYS

Norton's Zach Bainter placed second individually with a 16:16 time, which also broke his own meet course record of 16:51 which he set in winning last year's race.

Chris Maddy placed seventh for Norton in 17:59 and teammate David Counter was right behind him in 18:00 for eighth.

Jordan Bebb was fourth best runner for Norton, placing 11th in 18:10 and Luke VanSlike rounded out the Blue Jay five-man team with a 19th place in 18:44.

Also running for Norton were Troy Bainter, 26th in 19:05 and Kerby Brandyberry, 43rd in 20:28.

Josh Baden of Colby was the boys champion with a record-breaking time of 16:10. Baden also won the Hill City meet where Bainter finished in third place. Corey Heier, Hoxie, placed fourth in 17:26 and Andrew Richards, Oberlin, was fifth in 17:33.

Bryce Marble of Northern Valley was sixth in 17:44. Custer of Cambridge, Neb., was ninth in 18:08 and Wolf of Quinter, rounded out the top ten with a clocking of 18:09.

Seven Norton boys competed in the junior varsity race. Josh Gallentine placed third in 20:33, followed by Cole Archer, 12th in 21:47; Grant McClymont, 13th in 22:04; Kegan Vanover, 15th in 22:23; Zach Porter, 20th in 23:12; Matt Miller, 21st in 23:26; Adam Myers, 25th in 25:16.

Stanton Nelson of Northern Valley placed fifth in the junior varsity race in 20:43.

The Lady Jays' Laura Lee Baird placed fourth in 15:43 and Kara Jo Jones was seventh in 16:26.

Third best time for the Norton girls was recorded by Taylor Rossi, who was 18th in 17:17. She was followed by Kaylen Rossi in

19th with a time of 17:26.

Fifth best time for Norton was recorded by Dustyna Sprigg as she finished 26th in 18:19.

Also running for the Norton girls were Amanda Ray, who placed 34th in 18:49 and Kylie Morel, right behind her in 35th with a time of 18:51.

Katrina Kaus of Colby won the individual girls championship with a time of 15:25. Jennifer

Heim, Hoxie, was second in 15:26 and McConville of SouthWest was third in 15:39. Finishing behind Baird in fifth was Katherine Kaus of Colby in 15:56. Kayla Field of Northern Valley was sixth in 16:19. Stephanie Eberle of Hoxie was eighth in 16:29. Carpenter of Cambridge was ninth in 16:33 and Bailey Ochs of Hoxie rounded out the top 10 finishers with a time of 16:45.
