39-0 loss ends Blue Jays' football season

Bi-District championships, the Norton Community High School football team was denied a Class 3A Regional championship by Scott City on a sunny afternoon ground, Norton had to rely more on Saturday in Scott City.

The Blue Jay offense could never get untracked and the defense gave up too many yards in the 39-0 loss that ended Norton's season with an 8-3 record.

Scott City, who is now 7-4, will play Conway Springs on Friday for the Sectional championship. Eight teams are now left in the Class 3A playoffs. Games on Friday will narrow it down to four teams playing for the Sub-State championship on Friday, Nov. 16 with the State Championship contest set for Saturday, Nov. 24.

"The difference in the game was effort and intensity," said Norton head football coach Lucas Melvin. "They came out firing off the line and we didn't answer. At times we were blocked a little too easily and we didn't block them very well. We were hesitant for some reason.

"Preston Herman was an exception. He played very hard and left everything on the field. If we'd had more players give his type of effort, we'd have been better off.

"The last two games, we didn't play as hard as we had been. I realize we played three games in nine days, but we need to be tougher and look at it as an opportunity. We need to change our mindset. Instead of being happy with playing 10 or 11 games, we should want to play for it all.

"Looking at the season as a whole, I'm really proud of our seniors. They did a good job of being leaders and teaching the underclassman how to play. I also coached the seniors in junior high basketball and track. They are a good group and I feel sorry for them that they couldn't have gone farther."

The ten seniors on this season's Blue Jay grid squad were: Logan Kats, Jared Cox, Travis Ray, Wes Flower for no gain. It was fourth Georgeson, Todd Bolt, Aaron and 3 but Hughes earned a first Husted, Preston Herman, Kyle down by inches on the 35. Edgett, Alex Thomas and Zach Mannel.

Senior quarterback Chance Chelemedos plunged 1 yard for Scott City's second touchdown and the kick for extra point attempt was blocked by Norton's Todd Bolt, putting the Beavers ahead 13-0 with 8:39 left.

Hughes scored his second touchdown on an 18 yard run with 2:23 remaining and Chelemedos passed to Marshall Anliker for 2 extra points to make it 21-0.

With time running out in the second quarter, Chelemedos passed to Alex Swan for a 25 yard scoring pass and Bolt again blocked the extra point attempt, making it 27-0 at half-time.

Norton slowed the Beaver offense down in the second half but was unable to generate enough offense to make a game of it. Hughes scored on a 6 yard run with 3:04 left in the third period and Sam McDaniel plunged 1 yard for the Beavers' final touchdown with 7:04 left in the game to make the final 39-0.

Scott City had 17 first downs compared to 10 for Norton. The Beavers rushed for 218 yards, averaging 5 yards per carry, while holding the Blue Jays to 110 yards rushing and a 2.8 yard average. Scott City passed for 168 yards and Norton for 116. Total offense was 386 yards for Scott City and 226 for Norton.
