Johnson started his college wrestling career at the University of Central Oklahoma, where he compiled a record of 16-16. He transferred to Fort Hays this year and is wrestling at 149 pounds.

Annon has wrestled for Fort Hays both his freshman and sophomore seasons and is competing at 141 pounds. He had a 14-12 record his freshman year. He compiled a record of 16-11 and placed second in the NCAA Division II West

Regional/RMAC Championships his sophomore season.


