The good news was that they shutout Hays 82-0 but the bad news was that the grapplers from the Cornhusker State defeated them 49-10.

In the other dual of the evening, Kearney blanked Hays 80-0.

Neither of Norton's duals satisfied head coach Bill Johnson.

Norton ladies rough up Cowgirls

Norton also won the first time the two met in the opening round of the Topside Tip-Off Tournament in early December when the Lady Jays outscored Goodland 62-36.

This time around, both teams had 9 points after the first quarter but Norton outscored Goodland 13-4 in the second quarter to take a 22-13 half-time lead. A 14-8 third quarter in Norton's favor extended the Lady Jays' advantage to 36-21.

In the final stanza, both teams matched the 9 points each scored in the first quarter.

Laura Lee Baird led the way in scoring for Norton in the first half as she hit 15 of her gamehigh 17 points. She swished a three-pointer and two two-point baskets in the initial period, then hit two from beyond the arc along with another two-point shot in the second quarter.

For the game, she connected on 3 of 4 from long range for 75 percent, 4 of 7 two-point tries for

57 percent and 7 of 11 overall for for 32 percent. 64 percent accuracy.

Taylor Rossi helped the offensive cause in the second half by burying two shots from beyond the arc in the third quarter and ending with 8 points on 2 of 5 from long range for 40 percent, 1 of 2 twopoint tries for 50 percent and 3 of 7 overall for 43 percent.

Sammie Raymer was leading scorer for Goodland with 11 points, which included the Lady Cowgirls' only basket from beyond the arc.
