## Blue Jay wrestlers win ninth straight league crown

Coach Bill Johnson's Norton Community High School wrestling team's winning streak in the Mid-Continent League Tournament continued Saturday with the Blue Jays powering to their ninth straight championship!

Leading from start to finish, Norton amassed 204 points to outdistance defending Class 3-2-1A co-state champion Smith Center, who finished second with 190.

Third place went to Phillipsburg with 136, followed by Osborne, 73; Ellis, 64; Plainville, 56; Stockton, 53; Hill City, 29; Trego Community, 19.

All 14 Norton wrestlers medaled as the Blue Jays crowned four champions, had four runner-ups, two third placers and four fourth place finishers.

Winning gold medals for the Blue Jays were freshman Troy Bainter, 103; junior Zach Bainter, 135; junior Matt Stanley, 160 and senior Alex Thomas, 285

Runner-up places on Saturday went to freshman Billy Broeckelman, 112; sophomore Kaenon Keiswetter, 125; senior Todd Bolt, 140 and senior Jeff Soderlund, 152.

Norton compiled a won-loss record of 30-14 and had a pin ratio of 15-4.

"We knew coming in that it would be tough to beat Smith Center but we had a total team effort and placed every one of our wrestlers in the top four of their weight classes," said coach Johnson. "That in itself is a good reason we outdistanced everyone else.

"Those last 14 matches were all pretty tough. We had a fairly balanced attack with eight in the championship finals and six going for third.

"It was nice not having anyone in the back side after the first round. Our coaches never left the mats. It was kind of like a Norton dual versus the rest of the league.

"We avenged some losses from earlier in the season and that was good to see. Zach Bainter got a big win over Dustin Zahorsky of Phillipsburg, who had beaten him before. Zane Perez defeated Plainville's D.J. Brown, who had pinned him at Hoxie. Jordan Bebb beat Jesse Mudd of Smith Center for the second time but Mudd had beaten him once.

Placing third were sophomore Atwood of Smith Center but he pinned him this time."

103, second, Manhattan; Don Strevey, 165, second, Omaha; James Mulder, 112, fourth, Fremont, Neb.; Kenneth Sanderson, 145, fourth, deceased; Dwight Johnson, 154, fourth, Littleton, Colo. Coach Paul Casper is deceased. The four state placers from the

1958 team were also unable to attend. They were: Jim Kent, 123, second; Alvin Bird, 141, third, Winfield; Neil Severns, 157, third, Norton; Larry Taylor, 98, fourth, Perryton, Tex. The 1968 Norton wrestling

team won the state championship, had seven medalists and was coached by Jake Durham. Accepting their certificates of excellence were Roger Fisher, 95, first, Jamestown, N.D., Stan Ward, 112, first, Edmond, Okla. and Garrett Gwaltney, 180, second, Lansing.

Other medal winners from 1968 who were not able to attend were: Paul Riemann, Valley Center, 120, second and Quentin Horning, Peck, 138, first.

Coach Durham was honored for coaching the 1968 championship team. It was the fourth of six state champion teams coached by Jake.

There were two state medal-

ists from the 1978 team. Kyle Hahn, Ness City, was second at 105 pounds and Mike Jimenez, Fresno, Calif., was third at 155 pounds. Neither was able to attend but nephews Tyler and Seth Hahn accepted Kyle's certificate.

Kendall Hahn, Omaha, was the only state medalist from the 1988 team. He was not present but his sons, Tyler and Seth, accepted his award.

The 1998 team placed second in the state tournament and was coached by Bill Johnson. There were five state medalists and four were present. They were: Kyle Wright, Norton, 152, second; Curtis Brown, 171, first, Tulsa; Shaun Smiley, Kansas City, Mo., 215, second and Rusty Miller, Norcatur, 275, first.

Team medalist not able to be present was Brent Brandyberry, Chicago, 103, first.

This was the 43rd annual wrestling tournament held in Norton and the 11th annual Durham tournament. It was renamed 10 years ago in honor of J.R. "Jake" Durham of Norton.

Jake's honors include membership in the National Wrestling Hall of Fame and Kansas High School Wrestling Hall of Fame. Jake and his wife, Ruth, still reside in Norton.

Coach Johnson began to recognize the "Norton Wrestling Tradition" during his first year here in 1992. Over the past 16 years, 290 state medalists have been honored.

Making the introductions to the crowd over the public address system was Eric Farber, the current "Voice of the Blue Jays".
