# WEEKLY SERMONETTE

"These things I have spoken to you, that you should not be made to stumble. They will put you out of the synagogues; yes, the time is coming that whoever kills you will think that he offers God service. And these things they will do to you because they have not known the Father nor Me." (Jn. 16:1-3)

Here Jesus speaks to his disciples about a time coming when people would persecute them and even kill them while believing that they are doing God a favor by these actions. Think of how far this thinking is from the truth, that people would actually believe that in killing those who are God's children, they are helping Him. Could anyone be more wrong than this? I can't imagine someone thinking they were helping me by hurting or killing the ones I love.

Yet, we see this prediction of Jesus fulfilled very shortly into the early church in the book of Acts as persecution broke out against the new believers. The religious leaders of that day, including the man who would later become the Apostle Paul stoned, jailed, and scattered the early Christians, thinking that they were destroying God's enemies.

A thousand years later, Crusaders, in the name of Christ, made their way into the holy land, thinking they were doing God's service by slaughtering countless Muslims and other middle eastern peoples as they hoped to take back this land.

Today as well, we see

Islamic terrorists taking their own lives, while killing innocent men, women, and children whom they see as God's enemies because they are Jews, Christians, or supporters of Israel. Many similar events have taken place over the years in many places. Again the question: how could one do these things while thinking they

are doing God a favor? Jesus said in the verse at the beginning (Jn 16:3) that they will do these things "because they have not known the Father, nor Me." In other words, if people really knew God, through personal interaction, communion, until they really catch His heart, they wouldn't do these kinds of things. Even the disciples


had to be rebuked by Jesus when they wanted to call down fire upon Samaritans who wouldn't welcome them. Jesus pointed out that He didn't come into the world to destroy life but to save lives. Yes God will judge the world and punish wickedness, but at this time, as with Jesus, our mission is to seek and to save, not search and de-

> stroy. God's heart is the heart of the prodigal son's father who looked continually for His wayward son to come home. (Luke 15).

> The problem is that we see God through the wrong filters. We understand Him in the light of our traditions, teachings, desires, etc. But scripture teaches that Jesus is the exact representation of God. If we want to see the Father, above all, we must look at Him through the life of Jesus.

> Another problem is trying to understand God through "long distance learning". The problem isn't just that people don't know about God, they don't know Him. Teaching can be a great thing, but learningthattakesplace "at the feet of Jesus" is the only kind that can insure that we don't miss God's heart as in the examples above.

We must always give ourselves, in all our Christian learning, to the one thing which Jesus said was necessary, to know Him. This alone will transform our lives in ways that truly please Him, and not just what we imagine will make Him

#### **VICTORIOUSLY LIVING** OVER THE FLESH

WHICH DESIRE ARE YOU FEEDING?

Romans 8:13 says, "For if ye live after the flesh, ye shall die: but if ye through the Spirit do mortify the deeds of the body, ye shall die." (King James)

Mortification is the special ministry that enables the child of God to overcome those evil desires that could destroy the Christian's relationship with the Lord: Jesus gives a clear teaching that will pave the way of putting to death the sinful nature. He said, "The eye is the lamp of the body. If your eyes are good, your whole body will be full of light. But if your eyes are bad, your whole body will be full of darkness." (Matthew 6:22-23)

Every moment of the day we are feeding. What we feed on will grow in our minds and hearts. That is what is going to flow out of our lives. Just as our bodies reflect what and how much we eat, our lives will reflect what we feed the mind, spirit and soul.

Ed Wood shared the story he heard about an Indian who had come to Christ. When asked about his new found faith he described it as having two dogs living inside him. One is like an old dog. He is mean, vicious, unmanageable, and down right un-trainable. The second is like a new dog that is obedient, longs to serve Christ, and gives attention to the Lord. He described the two dogs as always fighting to get his attention and wanting to have control over his entire life. When asked what dog wins he replied back with, "The one I feed the most."

In dealing with the sinful nature, Christians have to become like a man who owns an old dog that is un-trainable, refuses to obey, always finds trouble when turned loose, bites children and causes a path of destruction wherever he goes. Finally the law shows up on his porch with a court order informing this man that he must fulfill his duty and restrain the dog for the protection of himself and the safety of the community. Thus, the man restrains the dog with something that is stronger than himself. He puts the dog on a chain.

Today's text, Romans 8: 13 informs the Christian of his duty. The restraining order is to mortify the flesh and become dead to that sinful nature. Which Dog are you feeding?
