Norton boys top Plainville

By DICK BOYD nortontelegram@nwkansas.com In their final game of the league season, the Norton Community High School boys varsity basketball team defeated Plainville 51-44 in Mid-Continent League action Monday night in Plainville.

It was a hard-fought contest with the Cardinals holding a 10-8 edge after one quarter and 23-20 advantage at half-time. Norton tied the score at 35-all by the end of the third stanza.

The game was still tight when senior point guard Logan Kats hit his second basket from long range in the quarter with 1:30 left to give Norton a 46-44 lead. The Blue Jays hit the final 5 points at the free throw line with Kats and senior guard Jared Cox each hitting two charities and sophomore guard J.D. Gall sinking one.

"We didn't play that well but found a way to win at the end," said Norton head boys coach Doug Reusink.

"The three-point baskets by Logan Kats and free throws at the end made the difference."

Kats was leading scorer for Norton with 18 points, 13 of them coming in the second half. He hit 3 of 5 from beyond the arc for 60 percent, 2 of 7 two-point attempts for 29 percent and 5 of 12 overall for 42 percent.

Senior forward Wes Georgeson tallied 11 points on 4 of 12 from the field for 33 percent and 3 of 7 from the charity stripe for 43 percent. He missed two three-point tries.

Leading scorers for Plainville were Toby Ruder with 12 and Justin Lacy with 10.


