
"Stealing honors went to Megan C. as she took 7 from the Roosters while Jessica Largent swiped 3.

"Assists were dished out by Christina Anderson with 5 while Megan Cole, Staci Dole, Hilburn and Largent each found 2," the coach said.


"We will take what we learned from this game, correct it and hope to meet Palco again. When we do, it will be for the Regional Championship," he said.


