nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Coach Bill Johnson's Norton Community High School varsity wrestling team scored twice as many points on Saturday as the leaders in the Class 3-2-1A State Wrestling Tournament in Gross Memorial Coliseum in Hays but was too far behind to earn the

championship and placed fourth. Smith Center, who tied Beloit for the state championship last year when Norton placed third just 1.5 points behind, won the title outright this year, although by just one point!

The Redmen finished with 127.5 points and the Panthers totaled 126.5. Beloit was third with 121.5 and Norton scored 101.5 to finish in fourth.

When Friday's competition was completed, Smith Center led with 103 points, followed by Phillipsburg, 101.5; Beloit, 97.5; Scott City, 64 and Norton 54.5.

With only one wrestler going for a championship, the Blue Jays wrestled hard through the back door (consolation bracket) all day Saturday to earn 47 points, compared to 24.5 by Smith Center, 25 by Phillipsburg, 24 by Beloit and 21 by Scott City.

Despite almost doubling their first day total, the Blue Jays were too far behind to make a run for the championship and were just able to pass Scott City and move up one team place.

Scott City finished with 85 points, followed by Oakley with 69 in sixth, Rossville with 56 in seventh, Hoisington with 48.5 in eighth, St. Francis with 46.5 in ninth and Silver Lake in tenth with 46. Osborne finished eleventh with 45, Atwood was twelfth with 42, Plainville was sixteenth with 34.5, Stockton placed eighteenth with 31.

Other area teams' finishes were Hill City, 25th, 21; Hoxie, 42nd, 12.5; Oberlin, 44th, 11.5; Ellis, tie for 50th, 4; Trego, tie for 50th, 4.

In winning last week's regional tournament for the fourth straight year, Norton qualified 11 wrestlers for the state tournament.

Also competing for Norton in the state tournament but not placing were sophomore Zane Perez, 130; senior Jeff Soderlund, 152; junior Matt Stanley, 160 and junior Brock Lauer, 189.

Junior Jordan Bebb, who placed fourth in the regional at 171 pounds to qualify for the state tournament, injured his back in his final regional match and was unable to compete. His season record was 21-17.

Senior Alex Thomas, 285, who placed third in the state tournament last season, suffered a season-ending knee injury after pinning two opponents in the regional and ended the season with a 28-1 record.

A total of 224 wrestlers who qualified in the previous week's four regional tournaments competed and a total of 77 different schools were represented.

Norton compiled a respectable 26-17 won-loss record and 10-4 pin ratio.




