Track troops open season first and third

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com The Norton Community High School girls and boys track teams took advantage of nearly perfect weather on Friday to place first and third, respectively, in the annual Norton Invitational Track Meet held on the Jep Byrum Track at Travis Field.

The Lady Jays amassed 168.6 points to easily outdistance second place Colby for the championship. The Lady Eagles totaled 121.6 points and were followed in third place by Phillipsburg with 113.7. Fourth place went to Smith Center with 55, followed by Northern Valley, 50.6; Logan, 23.5 and Goodland, 7.

Colby powered to the boys championship with 158 points, followed by Phillipsburg in second with 122 and Norton in third with 95.5. Smith Center placed fourth with 70, followed by Northern Valley, 42.5; Logan, 38 and Goodland, 25.

"This was a wonderful season opening meet for our varsity squads with our girls winning and boys finishing third," said Norton head coach Jason Jones.

"It is always difficult to tell in preseason where the points are going to fall so it always feels good to get out and compete and see where we need to go to work to become more competitive as a team.

"We are very, very pleased with the times and distances that many of our youngsters were able to post this early in the season! It is great to see them experience benefits of their hard work in practice. Our junior varsity athletes, who were coming off a meet on Monday, had their second chance to compete in this opening week of the competitive season and some of them bettered their performances and scored some points in this varsity meet.

"The weather was awesome and our girls and boys took advantage of that. They were able to establish some early marks and we will use those results to set some goals for the remainder of the season.

"We are very excited about continuing to compete and the opportunity to better ourselves as the season really begins to pick up in the coming weeks.

Girls

Norton junior Laura Lee Baird appeared to be in mid-season form as she won two individual gold medals and anchored a Lady Jay relay to another gold.

In the 400 meter dash, she was timed in 59.78 seconds, just off her personal record of 58.4 which she set last year in placing fourth in the state meet. She won her second individual gold with a first place in the 800 meter run with an excellent time of 2:23.69.

Baird anchored the Norton 4 x 400 meter relay team to a first place finish in 4:21.78. Her relay teammates were senior Courtney LeClair, junior KaraJo Jones and freshman Dustyna Sprigg.

LeClair also won a gold medal in the 300 meter hurdles with an excellent time of 48.95, was second in the 100 meter hurdles in another good time of 16.93 and was a member of the second place 4 x 100 meter relay team.

Junior Hayli Bozarth won a gold medal and two silver medals in the field events. She heaved the shot 39'5.5' to easily win that event and placed second in the discus with a throw of 120'11" and second in the javelin with a distance of 109'2".

Jones earned three silver medals. She was second in the long jump with a leap of 15'7", second in the 200 meter dash in 28.16 and ran on Norton's second place 4 x 100 meter relay team, which was timed in 53.72. Running with her on the relay team were LeClair, junior Taylor Rossi and sophomore Hannah Waggoner.

Norton's other girls gold medal winner was Rossi, with a clearance of 8'6" in the pole vault to tie for first with Joni Hilburn, Northern Valley. Rossi was a consistent 9' vaulter at the end of last season. Rossi also placed fifth in the 100 meter dash in 14.30.

Waggoner placed second in the 100 meter dash in 13.6 and third in the 200 meter dash in 28.41.

Norton's 4 x 800 meter relay team of senior Courtney Cox, junior Amyla Tan, freshman Kaylen Rossi and freshman Bekah Streck placed second with a clocking of 12:14.89.

Junior Wivanna Paxton finished second in the shot put event with a heave of 33'10", third in the javelin with a personal best throw of 102'6" and fifth in the discus

Kaylen Rossi also placed third in the 3200 meter run in 14:35.62.

Sophomore Alyssa Thomson won the bronze medal in the high jump by clearing 4'8".

Sophomore Raven Brown set a personal record in the 100 meter dash with a time of 14.18 to place fourth. Brown also placed fifth in the 200 meter dash in 29.43.
