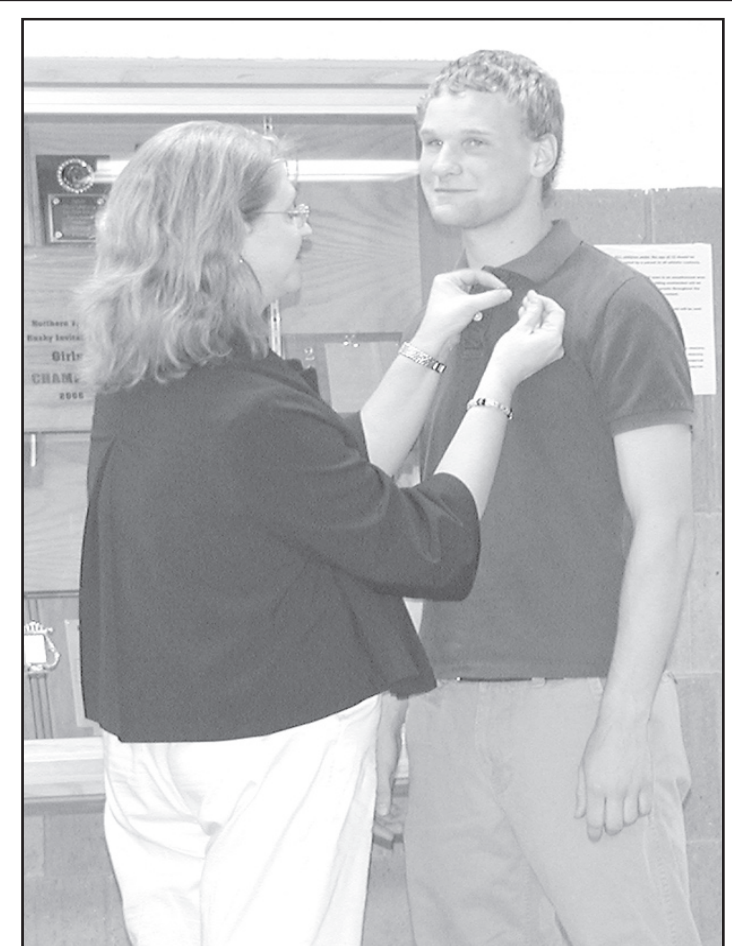
A Family Dinner Party is planned for 6 p.m. Wednesday. If you would like to attend, please
