

Girls second in league

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Coach Jason Jones' Norton Community High School girls and boys track teams turned in some outstanding performances to place second and fourth, respectively, in the annual Mid-Continent League Track Meet on Friday on the brand new track at Phillipsburg High School.

Osborne won the girls championship with 122 points, followed by Norton, 102; Ellis, 75; Smith Center, 74; Phillipsburg, 73; Hill City, 57; Plainville, 40; Trego, 8; Stockton, 6.

The boys championship went to Phillipsburg with 157 points, followed by Smith Center, 129; Osborne, 74; Norton, 71; Hill City, 43; Stockton, 25; Ellis, 24; Trego, 31; Plainville, 12.

"Our athletes did well, though going in, we were planning and hoping to leave the meet with more points and higher team finishes on both sides," said coach Jones. "I think our athletes were a little disappointed at the end of the day and it is easy to feel that way but we have absolutely nothing to hang our heads about! We showed up and competed very hard all day long and a lot of great things happened for us!

"Our girls finished second for the first time this season to a very good Osborne team. We continued to improve in many areas, setting a total of nine new personal records! Again, we love to see these performances coming at this point and we will work to continue to improve our marks as we head into regionals and the state meet over the next two weeks.

"Highlighting our day on the girls side, Laura Lee Baird set a new school record in the 1600 meter run, beating the old record by a little over four seconds in her event-winning performance. In addition, Hayli Bozarth set a new school record in the shot put, bettering her own Norton record she set the week before at Russell by almost three feet! This effort also gave her the new league record in that event and she also set a new league record in the discus!

Lady Jay junior Hayli Bozarth had a day to remember in the shot put and discus. She had broken Brenda Wolf's school record in the shot of 42'2.75" which had stood since 1982 when she heaved the iron ball 42'8.75" in the Russell Relays the previous Friday. Not only did she break this record throwing from the new ring at Phillipsburg but she broke it all four times she threw, the longest being 45'3.5"! Wolf's distance was also the league record.

In the discus, Hayli had a number of excellent throws, the longest being 138'5", which broke the league mark of 127'11" set by B. Ubelaker, Osborne, in 2003. Hayli threw the discus 143'4" at Russell to set a new meet record and break her own school record of 132'2", which she set last season.

Second to her was Plainville's Frederking in 5:20.66, third fastest on the honor roll.

Laura Lee also won the 800 meter run, where she is also the honor roll leader, in the excellent time of 2:21.53. Frederking was second in 2:25.94.
