

In addition, Norton senior Preston Herman was third medalist and qualified for the state tournament by being one of the next five lowest scorers not members of the two qualifying teams. Herman actually tied for second medalist but lost a three-hole playoff.

Hoisington placed third among teams with a 391 and Norton was right behind with a 398. Fifth place went to Holcomb with a 404, followed by Cimarron, 410; Scott City, 420; Thomas More Prep of Hays, 452; Larned, 501

Preston Herman shot a 42-45-87 to lead the Blue Jay foursome. Next came sophomore J.D. Gall, 53-47-100; senior Kyle Edgett, 53-51-104 and sophomore Marcus Herman, 56-51-107.
