Logan getting ready for huge annual event

It's not too early to be planning, and for Logan the planning is well underway for its 32nd annual Labor Day Celebration on Aug. 31. The location will be the golf

course on Hwy. 9, 1 1/4 miles east of Logan. Sponsored by the Dane G. Han-

sen Memorial Foundation, there is no admission charge. Activities begin at 8 a.m. with

an ecumenical church service, a remote control fly-in and a sand volleyball tournament.

The Logan Chamber of Commerce food booth and the Sno-Cone Shack will open at 10 a.m. The Dane G. Bales Junior Memorial Car Show begins at 10 a.m. and concludes at 4 p.m. The car show will feature many makes and varieties.

The Kansas Hunters' Education Instructors' Association Pellet Range will be available from 10 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The RTS Express, a climbing wall and a 22' slide will also entertain the children. The Van De Creek State Sanctioned Kids' Tractor Pull begins at 2 p.m. Winners are eligible to compete at the Kansas State Fair in Hutchinson.

Two mounted drill teams will perform between 4 and 5:30 p.m. They are the Prairie Dusters Mounted Drill Team from the Logan area and the Buffalo Soldiers Drill Team from the Nicodemus area. These are always crowd favorites.

Musical entertainment will be provided by two noted musical groups. Appearing on stage at 5:30 p.m. will be "The Warnock Family" of Branson, Mo., and at 7:30 p.m., the "McLemore Family" from Colby.

The Warnock family numbers six - Mom Sandi, Dad Jamie and four daughters, Ashlee 19, Anna 17, Rhonda 16 and Emilee 13. They sing and dance to an eclectic array of music from the 1920s to present day. Their shows are action packed with dancing, instruments, humor and beautiful vocals.

Their musical format moves quickly from oldies to rock-nroll, gospel, to pop, then country and even some of their own originals.






