

# Logan player starter in 8-Man All-Star contest

Payton Chestnut, a 6'4", 250 pound all-conference lineman from Logan High School, started for the victorious West stars in the 23rd annual Division II 8-Man All-Star Football Game and anchored the offensive line most of the game.

Payton had an especially good block late in the fourth quarter which broke West back Matthew Vopat of Wilson free on a long touchdown run in the 42-24 victory.

Payton is the son of Brenda and Dennis Chestnut.

Wes Landis, a 5'8", 155 pound back from Palco, also saw a lot of playing time for the West squad. In addition to playing much of the time in the defensive secondary, he also saw action at tailback and scored one of the West touchdowns on a two yard run.

Wes is the son of Velma and Fred Landis.

The star of the game was Jeff Hennick, quarterback for the 13-0 state champion Sharon Springs Wildcats. Hennick passed for 1,324 yards and 23 touchdowns

during the season and had a similar performance on Saturday. He completed 14 of 17 aerials for 200 yards, including three touchdowns and a pair of two-point conversions. It was the fourth most passing yards in an eight-man all-star game.

Hennick's teammate Taylor Elder also delivered for the West. The 1,466 yard running back, returned kicks and punts and caught three long passes from Hennick that helped set up scores. Elder also was a stalwart on defense.

The West concentrated on running plays in the first quarter to take an 8-0 lead. Hennick's first big play came when he connected with Elder on a 25-yard completion midway in the second quarter. Three plays later, Hennick passed for a touchdown and connected with Elder for a two-point conversion.

Hennick found Elder again with 98 seconds left in the first half. Throwing on a 90 degree day with a 37 mile per hour wind, Hennick saw Elder behind the defense and hit him for a 30-yard strike. The pass set up a nine-yard touchdown pass from Hennick to Moscow's

Tony Ivan Granillo to make it 22-2 at half-time.

After a 22-yard touchdown pass by Hennick and safety, the West led 30-2 at the end of three quarters. The East scored their first touchdown with 11:56 left in the game. The West responded by driving downfield for another touchdown when Landis hit paydirt on a sweep to make it 36-10. The East scored with 4:04 left to make it 36-16 but, on the West's next possession, Chestnut opened a hole for the West's final touchdown with 3:12 showing. A touchdown by the East with 13 seconds left cut the final margin of victory to 42-24.

Head coach of the West team was Doug Oberle of Victoria. His assistant coaches were Kevin Ayers, Sharon Springs and Ben Labertew, Natoma.

It is the third time in four years that the West has won the game.

The Division I 8-Man All-Star Game was played in the morning and Kensington's Ethan Kuhlmann and Randall Irving were among the East players. Both young men saw a lot of playing time in the East's 28-18 victory.

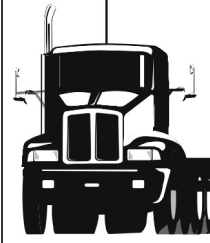
