Six individuals have been chosen for induction on Oct. 11, into the Tigers Sports Hall of Fame at Fort Hays State University.

Honored will be Mike Appelhans, Hill City, track and field; Casey Seyfert, Beloit, football, track and field; Garry Sigle, Osborne, cross country/track and field; Skip Numrich, Scott City, football; Dennis Edwards, Annapolis, Md., basketball and Tom Spicer, athletic director/contribu-

They will be inducted in Eagle Communication Hall of the Robbins Center at 10 a.m. and will also be honored at half-time of the football game between Fort Hays and Missouri Southern, starting at 2 p.m.

Mike Appelhans (2000-03)

Appelhans was a 10-time All American in track and field. Seven of his All-America honors came in outdoor track.

As a sophomore, Appelhans was the anchor leg on the NCAA Division II outdoor national championship 400 meter relay team. He earned All-American honors four years in outdoor track and field as a member of Tiger 400 meter squads, which earned second place finishes during his junior and senior years and a third place finish his freshman year.

Appelhans also earned All-America status twice in the 200 meter dash, with third being his highest finish nationally as a senior, and once in the 100 meter dash, with a sixth place finish as a freshman.

Indoors, Appelhans was a threetime All-American, earning honors twice in the 60 meter dash and once in the 55 meter dash. Appelhans still owns three individual school records (outdoor 100 meters, outdoor 200 meters and indoor 200 meters) and was a member of the 400 meter relay team which holds the school record in outdoor track and field.

He was the Most Valuable Athlete in the RMAC Outdoor Championships in 2000 and 2002.

Appelhans is currently a resi-

dent of Hill City. **Casey Seyfert (1998-02)**

Seyfert was a standout athlete in football and track. He played football for the Tigers from 1998 to 2001, earning first team All-America honors in football as a defensive lineman his senior year. He had 55 tackles, 17.5 tackles for loss and seven sacks. In his career, he amassed 126 tackles, 41.5 tackles for losses and 17 sacks.

Seyfert competed in track from 1999 to 2002. He was a two-time NCAA Division II indoor track national champion in the shot put,

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in 2001 and was a four-time indoor All-American in the shot put. He was also a two-time outdoor All-American in the shot put, finishing second in 2000. He owns the and was a two-time all-RMAC school records for shot put for both indoor and outdoor.

Garry Sigle (1974-78)

Sigle was a two-time NAIA cross country (1975 and 1977) All-American in the two mile (1976 and 1978, placing second

In outdoor track, Sigle was an NAIA honorable mention All-American in the 10,000 meters in 1978, placing fifth at nationals. He was a two-time CSIC outdoor champion (1976, 1978) in the three mile and a four-time all-conference performer in cross

He is cross country coach at Riley County High School.

Skip Numrich (1976-1977)

Numrich was an Associated Press All-American honorable mention quarterback in 1976. That year he set six individual school records and led the CSIC in passing with 1,562 yards. He helped the Tigers win their only CSIC championship in 1976, going 5-1 in conference play.

He ranks fifth in touchdowns in a single season with 17 his junior year in 1976. He ranks sixth on the career passing yards list at Fort Hays with 2,952, sixth on the career passing attempts list with 426, sixth on the passing completions list with 216 and sixth on the passing touchdowns list with 27. He played two seasons at Fort

Dennis Edwards (1994-1995)

Edwards was a force for the Fort Hays basketball team during his two years on the team, earning All-American honors in both

SIDA National Player of the Year as a senior, was named the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Player of the Year both seasons first team selection.

Edwards holds the school's single-season scoring record with 806 points in 1994-95. He also All-American for the Tigers in has the seond highest season total at Fort Hays with 799 in 1993and a two-time NAIA indoor track 94 and ranks first and second in single season points average with a 26.9 average in 1994-95 and 25.8 average in 1993-94. He has the only two 50 point games in Tiger history and owns the next three highest point games in school history. Edwards broke the 30 point mark 22 times in his career.

Tom Spicer (1989-2004)

Spicer was Fort Hays athletic director for 15 years. He presided over two national championship teams, the 1990-91 NAIA women's basketball and the 1995-96 NCAA Division II men's bas-

He also led the athletic department in 2000 when the baseball team earned NCAA Division II World Series runner-up honors.

Spicer was largely responsible for improvements at Lewis Field Stadium. He also implemented softball and women's golf as the school's 15th and 16th varsity

Spicer is currently athletic director at Colorado School of Mines, Golden, Colo
