Osborne

of the Wichita State University track and field team.

He ran the 100 meter dash, 200 meter dash and 400 meter dash for the Shockers

and was also a valuable member of their 4 x 400 meter and 4 x 100 meter relay

Jared was chosen 2007-2008 Shockers. Although a senior academically, he was a junior in eligibility due to a medical red shirt last season when he fractured an ankle prior to the season and did not run either indoor or outdoor.

In the indoor season opener on Saturday, Jan. 19 in the Kansas Invitational at Lawrence, Jared placed third in the 400 meter dash with a time of 50.27. He returned to Lawrence on Friday, Jan. 25 for the Jayhawk Classic and placed sixth in the 200 meter dash in 22.5

In the Air Force Invitational in Colorado Springs, Colo. on Friday and Saturday, Feb. 1 and 2, Jared led the way for the Shocker sprinters by earning a spot in the finals of the 200 meter dash, with a time of 21.97, fourth, and the 400 meter dash with a clocking of 49.21, fifth best. His 200 meter time placed him fifth all-time at Wichita State University in that event in indoor competition.

In the finals, he placed fifth in the 400 meter dash with a careerbest time of 48.94 but did not finish the 200 meter finals race due to a pulled hamstring.

Next, he competed in the Missouri Valley Conference Indoor Championships in Cedar Falls, Iowa on Saturday and Sunday, March 1-2. In the preliminaries of the 200 meter dash, he placed second with a time of 22.01 and ran the distance in 21.99 in the

To open the 2008 outdoor season, he placed 12th in the 200 meter dash in 22.19 seconds in the Nike Elite Meet at Sacramento State in Sacramento, Calif. His 4 x 400 meter relay team placed first with a clocking of 3:12.12.

Next, he lowered his time in the 200 meters to 21.71 to place fourth in the K.T. Woodman Track Classic on April 13 at Wichita State in the only home meet of the season for the Shockers. Jared and his teammates combined to win the 4 x 400 meter relay in 3:14.88 and the 4×100 meter relay in 42.59.

On Saturday, May 10 in the Sooner Twilight in Norman, Okla., Jared's 4 x 400 meter relay team won the competition with a time of 3:10.32 but missed regional standards by just .32 of a second. His 4 x 100 meter relay team placed third with a 41.44 clocking.

On May 16, he ran both sprints again in the Missouri Valley Conference Championships. He placed seventh in the 200 meter He competed in the 400 meter dash preliminaries in a personal ninth. In the 100 meter dash, Jared placed 11th in the preliminaries with a personal record time of 10.94.

Jared anchored the 4 x 100 meter relay team to a third place finish with a season best time of 41.27. He was also a member of the 4 x 400 meter relay team again but pulled a hamstring in the fourth with a time of 3:10.94 to preliminaries and couldn't run in

fourth in 3:17.32.

The Shocker men's team placed second in the outdoor championships and the women's squad placed fourth.

Jared is the record-holder at Norton Community High School in the 400 meter dash with a 49.6 clocking.

He is the son of Anna and Craig Foley of Norton.

Jared graduated from Wichita State University in May, 2008, with a bachelor of arts degree in Sports Administration and a minor in Business.

He is currently working on his internship with the WSU Track & Field coaching staff and will compete as a fifth year senior in 2008-2009.


