## Dream coming true for Norton women

Cindy Boller and Georgia Mann have been friends for more than 30 years. They have shared recipes back and forth, they love food, exploring new foods, and trying out new recipes. While at a market in Chicago, they came up with the idea for a specialty kitchen store in Norton.

Fast forward five months, and they're renting the old Kowpoke Supply building, doing some painting, remodeling and moving in stock. After brainstorming with family, "Destination Kitchen," suggested by Mrs. Mann's husband, was the agreed upon name for their new specialty kitchen store. They hope to be open by Oct. 1.

Diane Becker, Economic Development Director, suggested they go to the Destination Business Boot Camp in Colorado. They learned all they could, then came back to start their business.

Mrs. Mann and Mrs. Boller are in the process of remodeling their space for "Destination Kitchen." Walls are being repainted chocolate and cream, they are taking out windows and replacing them with doors, and most prominently, building a kitchen

for cooking demonstrations and classes. They've even put in a small room off to the side, which will be used for seating for lunch, bridge games, or even business meetings.

A light lunch counter will be put in, where customers can come in, get a sandwich and maybe some soup for lunch. Baked goods, gourmet food gift baskets and tea cakes will be available, as well. Most food items being sold in Destination Kitchen will be home made and fresh, with the exception if a customer wants something custom-ordered.

For the "foodies" in Norton, Destination Kitchen sells kitchen gadgets, knives, pots and pans, coffee makers and bakeware — to include Madeline pans.

"It will be a very unique combination of a kitchen, a kitchen store and food service," said Mrs. Boller.

Cookbooks and reference books will be available for customers to look through for ideas.

Both ladies say their families have been a big help, and that getting the store ready has been a group effort.

Mrs. Mann worked at Talking Books until July, and Mrs. Boller worked at the courthouse until

July. Now they both work full time getting their dream off the ground.
