Important ag deadline extended

Director for the United States Department of Agriculture's Kansas Farm Service Agency, said there is an extension deadline for the application closing date for certain crops under the Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program. Crops eligible for these benefits are limited to those not insurable in the county and are produced for raspberries), cherries, clover, food or fiber.

The original Sept. 1 deadline has been extended to Dec. 1, as the final date to pay the applicable service fee and obtain 2009 Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance coverage for barley, rye, triticale, wheat, aquaculture, canola, Christmas trees, nursery crops, speltz, and turf grass sod. The administrative service fee is \$250 per crop per administrative county not to exceed \$750 per producer per administrative county and a \$1,875 maximum fee for multi-county producers.

ST. FRANCIS — The county seat of Cheyenne County now has a new tornado siren which can be sounded at a moment's notice anytime — night or day.

Carol Gamblin, dispatch director, reported that the siren was installed last month after equipment was back ordered several times. The old siren, located at the power plant, could be sounded immediately if it was during working hours.

The tornado siren has sounded several times this summer as tornados were spotted in the immediate area. Fortunately, there have been no tornado warnings during the evening and night.
