and combines with pickup reels harvesting. I'd bet ya couldn't get 100 combines with pickup reels together for a photo shoot in the whole State of Kansas, much less in Norton. Plus, the 'B' train grain haulers couldn't gross more than 85,500 lbs., so it could haul four or five hundred bushels without being overweight. Good utilization

of equipment there." "For some reason," Mr. Borland said, "people seem to believe everything that shows up in their email box." And the response to the latest email pointing to Norton as the location of a world record speed harvest underscores Mr. Borland's comment.

Work on K-383 reportedly in full swing

 Construction work on K-383 Highway is in full swing, reports

the Phillipsburg office of the Kansas Department of Transportation, as crews are performing a mill

and overlay of that section of the corridor.

Beginning at the Norton/Phillips County line and extending east 15 miles to the K-383/US-183 Junction, Great Bend Contracting firm Venture Corporation — serving as the primary contractor — milled out 1/2 inch of the existing pavement and is currently placing 1 1/2 inches of asphalt material throughout the work zone.

"The entire construction process consists of two phases," said the Department of Transportation's Area One Construction Engineer Travis Scott. "They began the mill process last week and the asphalt overlay is now occurring."

A pilot car operation will halt and direct traffic through the construction zone during daylight hours. Local travelers will need to plan on a short delay of 15 minutes or less during the construction period.

"As always, we ask motorists to exercise caution in this and any other work zone in Kansas," said the department's Public Affairs Manager Kristen Brands of Norton. "Please slow down, and pay attention to the workers and signs."

Important ag deadline extended

Bill R. Fuller, State Executive Director for the United States Department of Agriculture's Kansas Farm Service Agency, said there is an extension deadline for the application closing date for certain crops under the Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program. Crops eligible for these benefits are limited to those not insurable in the county and are produced for food or fiber.

The original Sept. 1 deadline has been extended to Dec. 1, as the final date to pay the applicable service fee and obtain 2009 Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance coverage for barley, rye, triticale, wheat, aquaculture, canola, Christmas trees, nursery crops, speltz, and turf grass sod. The administrative service fee is \$250 per crop per administrative county not to exceed \$750 per producer per administrative county and a \$1,875 maximum fee for multi-county producers.

Interested producers must pay the fee and file form CCC-471, Application for Coverage, by the application closing deadline.

December 1 is also the final date to pay the applicable service fee and obtain Program coverage for all grasses including alfalfa, apricots, asparagus, blueberries, caneberries (blackberries and raspberries), cherries, clover, grapes, lespedeza, honey, mixed forage, nectarines, oats, peaches, plums, strawberries, and vetch.

This coverage entitles eligible producers to a payment of 55 percent of an average market

price for the commodity if a natural disaster caused a 50 percent production loss or greater of an eligible crop.

Producers must obtain the coverage on all 2009 non-insurable crops and purchase crop insurance on all 2009 insurable crops to remain eligible for the 2009 supplemental disaster assistance programs recently announced in the 2008 Farm Bill.

Interested producers should contact their local Farm Service Agency prior to the Dec. 1 application closing date to obtain this coverage.
