

Mile-High fireworks just a few days away

The outcome of the Democratic National Convention is not in doubt, but for many delegates who were supporters of Sen. Hillary Clinton attending the convention will be a historic moment in party history as Sen. Barack Obama will be declared the nominee for President.

Etta Walker, a Sharon Springs lawyer, was the only one chosen on April 12 at Hays from the 1st Congressional District to go to Denver as a Clinton delegate under state Democratic Party rules.

The 1st District elected four delegates to the national convention, and based on the rules, Clinton got one delegate and the rules said the delegate had to be a woman. Sen. Barack Obama was to get one woman delegate, two male delegates and one male alternate.

In April the presidential contest was hot and heavy with the winner still in doubt, but when all the smoke cleared by the middle of June Obama had clearly captured a majority of the delegates and Clinton had suspended her campaign.

Walker said Monday she was dis-

appointed her candidate would not win the nomination, and at first she thought about not going to Denver. "I thought it over, and decided it will be a once in a lifetime event," she said, "and I am excited to be one of those who will be there for the historic moment."

She said she is taking her daughter Catherine Jenkinson, 13, and has a ticket for both of them to attend the acceptance speech at Invesco Field at Mile-High on Thursday.

She said she has not seen a schedule of events for the delegation from the Kansas Democratic Party.

Jenny Davidson Kansas Democratic Party communications director said Wednesday she was sending out a schedule, and had been waiting on a couple of things to firm up before sending out the schedule.

Leonard Schamber of Damar was the other delegate from the 40th Senate District to win a delegate spot from the 1st District to the convention, and he is an Obama delegate. Kansas has 32 delegates to the convention plus 10 super delegates. Nine delegates were committed to Clinton and the other 23 were Obama. Most of the super delegates are technically uncommitted, but have indicated they will be supporting Obama.

Among the super delegates is

Kansas Gov. Kathleen Sebelius who is rumored to be on the short-list for Obama's choice for vice president. Sebelius who is one of three co-chairs for the convention.

Sen. Obama's campaign has indicated to press sources he will reveal his choice for vice president on Friday afternoon and the person will appear with him at a rally in Illinois on Saturday.

The 45th Democratic National Convention will be gavelled into session at 3 p.m. on Monday at the Pepsi Center in Denver, and will continue with sessions through Thursday with the final evening moving to Invesco Field for Obama's nomination acceptance speech.

The Kansas delegation will have breakfast meetings at 7 a.m. each morning at the Doubletree Hotel in the Denver Tech Center where the Kansas party office will be located. Delegates are to attend the breakfast to pick up their credentials for each day's convention events.

Delegates can attend any number of events in the morning and on Monday through Wednesday credentialed delegates will board a

bus at 1 p.m. for the ride to the Pepsi Center for the 3 p.m. opening of each day's session.

Among those slated to speak on Monday are former President Jimmy Carter, Speaker of the House Nancy Pelosi and Denver Mayor John Hickenlooper.

Tuesday's speakers include Convention Co-Chair Gov. Sebelius, Federico Peña, former Mayor of Denver and Secretary of both Energy and Transportation and Sen. Hillary Clinton.

Tuesday is the traditional day for the delegates to consider and adopt the party platform.

Speakers for Wednesday include Massachusetts Sen. John Kerry, President Bill Clinton of New York, Gov. Bill Richardson of New Mexico and Sen. Ken Salazar of Colorado.

The last item for Wednesday is the vice presidential acceptance speech.

Thursday speakers will include Colorado Gov. Bill Ritter and former Vice President Al Gore before the Obama acceptance speech.

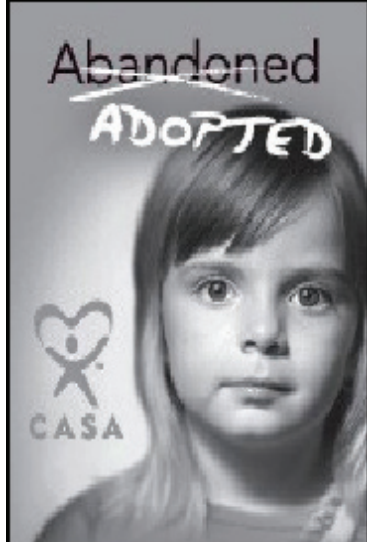
You are required to appear before this Court at 1:30 pm. on the 3rd day of September, 2008, or prior to that

PROFILE #1 "Health Profile & CBC" — \$40.00
Health Profile Contains:
ELECTROLYTES: (Sodium, potassium, chloride and total carbon dioxide). These are major indicators of kidney and hormonal functions. Electrolytes are essential for the body's acid-base balance and the operation of nerves and muscles, especially the heart.
KIDNEY FUNCTIONS: (BUN, creatinine). These indicators are used to monitor kidney function.
LIVER FUNCTIONS: (Total albumin, globulin). These tests can be used in detecting and/or monitoring liver function damage, tissue damage or inflammation.
ALKALINE PHOSPHATE: (Uric acid, calcium, phosphorus). Used for detection and monitoring of bone, tissue and parathyroid disease, such as arthritis, gout, bursitis and lupus.
GLUCOSE: This test is to measure blood sugar levels and is used to help diagnose/monitor diabetes mellitus.

CHOLESTEROL: (Including HDL, LDL, VLDL, triglycerides and ratio of LDL/HDL). These are fats produced in the liver that combine with fatty oils in the blood stream. Triglycerides determine the level of simple fats in the blood.
CBC: (Complete blood count with differential). This is a series of tests of the blood that provides a tremendous amount of information about the hematologic system, immune response and many other organ systems.

PSA—This test detects an enlarged prostate, infected prostate and/or prostatic cancer. It can be used to evaluate disease progression and to monitor treatment.

PROFILE #3 (TSH)—\$15.00
TSH—This test is used to evaluate thyroid function and detect if there is too much or too little hormone secreted by the thyroid.
