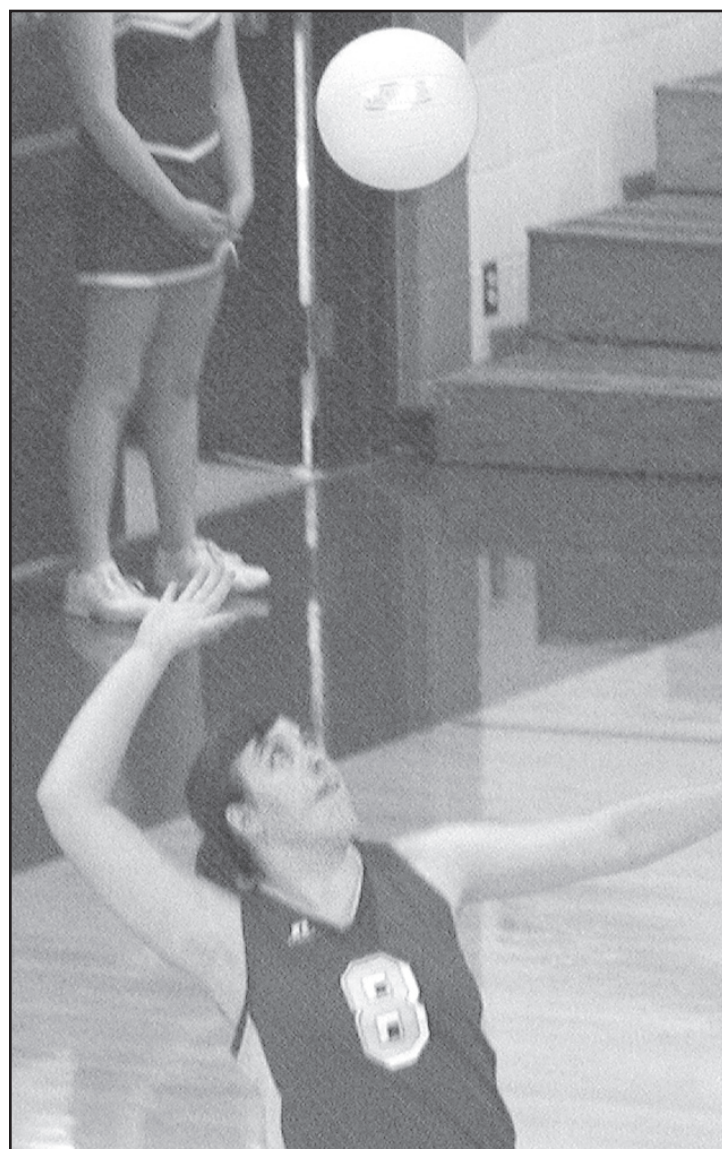


Friday night focus!

Logan Trojans trounce Lakeside

The Logan Trojans put on somewhat of a football clinic Friday night (Sept. 19) in their football clash with Lakeside, lighting up the scoreboard with 64 points while limiting Lakeside to 14.

The Trojans carried the ball 40 times for 306 yards. Kiser carried 14 times for 159 yards and 4 TDs; Sammons, 11 times for 93 yards and 3 TDs; B. Tien, 8 times for 50 yards and 1 TD; and J. Archer, 7 times for 4 yards. Lakeside carried the ball 40 times for 123 yards and 2 TDs.
