

# Jayvee football wins in overtime

The Norton Community High School junior varsity football team defeated Goodland 26-20 in an exciting game that went to overtime Monday evening at Travis Field in Norton.

Norton was leading 20-14 with 2:01 left in the game when Goodland tied the score with a 12 yard touchdown pass. The Blue Jays stopped the extra point attempt but Norton was unable to score on their final possession of regulation.

Norton had the ball first on offense in the extra period and could not score on the first three downs. On fourth down, quarterback Spencer Shirk connected with Brett Terrell in the end zone to put Norton ahead 26-20!

The young Jays then made a successful goalline stand high-

lighted by a pass interception by Jordan Wahlmeier.

Goodland jumped out to a 6-0 lead in the first quarter on a 40 yard pass play but the second quarter was all Norton. The offense put together their first sustained drive of the game, culminating in a 40 yard touchdown pass from Shirk to Dakota Dreher. The run for extra points was unsuccessful.

After forcing a turnover, the Blue Jays took the lead late in the second quarter, once again scoring through the airways. Shirk found Billy Broeckelman in the corner of the end zone for the score. Again, the run for extra points failed but Norton held a 12-6 advantage at halftime.

Both defenses were strong in the scoreless third quarter, setting the stage for fourth quarter fireworks. With 7:12 left, Goodland regained the lead with an 11 yard scoring

pass and ran for two extra points to make it 14-12.

Norton answered with just under four minutes to play with a 5 yard scoring run by Shirk. Shirk passed to Broeckelman for two extra points and Norton led 20-14.

The Cowboys used their passing attack to drive down the field and score on a 12 yard pass and tie the score at 20-all but their extra point attempt was stopped by the young Blue Jays.

"This was a hard-fought overtime victory," said Norton assistant coach David Stover. "We are really proud of our young men for never giving up and continuing to play aggressive football to eventually come out on top."

The Norton junior varsity grid- ders will travel to St. Francis on Monday for a 6 p.m. contest with the Indians.

"They struggled to return our serves but we seemed sluggish and weren't able to take advantage of the situation."

**Smith Center**

In the loss to Smith Center, Norton served 84 percent with 4 aces, passed 1.43 and had 5 kills.

"Despite the score, this was a much better match for us," said coach Lively.

"I would like to see us serve and pass better but, overall, our team was moving on the court and communicating well. It was a fun match for the spectators to watch as there was a lot of action at the net and some nice hits.
