# Norton coach figures in TV station's award

**BUNKER HILL** — Smoky Hills Public Television has been named a Media of the Year Award winner by the Kansas Wrestling Coaches Association for the station's coverage of the Kansas State High School Activities Association's 3-2-1A Wrestling State Championships.

The award was presented to Mary Pat Waymaster, the station's director of broadcasting, on Saturday, Nov. 1 at the association's 24th annual banquet in Salina.

Smoky Hills was nominated for the award by **Norton Community High School wrestling coach Bill Johnson and voted on by the KWCA Executive Board.**

Smoky Hills Public Television has broadcast the KSHSAA 3-2-

1A Wrestling State Championships for 25 years and several of these productions have received the Kansas Association of Broadcasters' award for "Best Non-Metro Sports Production".

In the early years, the station aired the competition on a taped, delayed basis but, for the last five years, the station has presented all of the quarter, semi and final rounds action live, plus an encore presentation of the finals, for a total of 11.5 hours of broadcast time devoted to 3-2-1A state wrestling, according to Waymaster.

"Smoky Hills Public Television has always recognized that celebrating the best of Kansas community life reinforces the values which hold our communi-

ties together," Waymaster said. "Certainly high school activities are important and deserve media coverage for the participants, coaches, schools and communities."

"Smoky Hills is honored to be recognized for our efforts towards enriching people's lives and making Kansas a better place to live."

In addition to its coverage of the 3-2-1 high school wrestling state championships, Smoky Hills also has produced taped, delayed broadcasts of the KSHSAA 8-Man Football Division I and II State Championships for the past six years.

The 2008 games are slated to air on Thanksgiving Day, Thursday,

Nov. 27, according to Waymaster.

The station also has produced broadcasts of the KSHSAA 1A Boys and Girls Basketball State Championships for the past three years.

"Scoreboard Show", Smoky Hills' highly popular, weekly high school sports roundup program, now in its sixth season, features Friday night coverage of football, cross country, girls golf and tennis, soccer and volleyball.

Last year, a total of 184 different teams or schools were videotaped for highlights.

Smoky Hill Public Television serves 70 counties in Kansas and one county in Nebraska. It is available on 120 cable systems, DirecTV and the Dish Network, which includes coverage in the Hutchinson and Wichita areas.

# Three Huskies chosen All-Conference

The Northern Valley High School varsity volleyball Huskies not only experienced a successful season, they also had three players chosen to the All-Conference Team. Alison Cole, Megan Cole and Christina Anderson were selected First Team, with Alison and Megan being chosen unanimously.

# Farm owners, operators of fewer base acres fit in Bill

Owners and operators of farms with 10 or fewer base acres now have the opportunity to receive payments for the 2008 Direct and Counter-cyclical Payment Program. On Oct. 13, President George W. Bush signed a bill that made amendments to the 2008 Farm Bill.

These amendments apply to farms with crop acreage bases of 10 acres or less. These changes and clarifications allow some producers more flexibility in farming practices and create new sign-up opportunities with new deadlines for some farms. The amendments also apply to the new Supplemental Revenue Assistance Program.

## 10-Base Acre Limit Changes

As originally enacted under the 2008 Farm Bill, direct and counter-cyclical payments could not be made with respect to farms with crop acreage bases of 10 acres or less. The new law makes that provision inapplicable for the 2008 crop year. Related to this, producers on a farm with 10 acres or less of base may now, under the new law, enroll their farms until Nov. 26 in the 2008 DCP program.

This extension of the original Sept. 30 deadline only applies to producers who were previously excluded because of the minimum acreage requirement. The United States Department of Agriculture began issuing payments to producers on farms with 10 base acres or less who had already enrolled in the payment program soon after President Bush signed the new law.

Farm Service Agencies will now resume allowing reconstitutions for farms with 10 acres of base or less according to normal reconstitution rules and policy.
