Blue Jays' football season ends at Beloit

Coach Lucas Melvin's Norton Community High School football team saw their outstanding 2008 season come to an end Saturday evening in Beloit with a 34-17 loss to the Trojans in the Class 3A Regional game, one of eight being played statewide.

The Blue Jays were on an emotional high to start the game and surprised the Trojans by taking a 14-0 lead before Beloit had a single first down. Unfortunately, the Trojans rallied, the cold adversely affected Norton quarterback Connor Pfannenstiel's throwing accuracy and the Jays lost leading rusher Terrell Lane with a knee injury late in the first half. Still, the Trojans led by just 20-17 after three quarters but three pass interceptions by Beloit in the second half, two of which led to touchdowns, allowed the Trojans to pull away for the victory.

Cas Spangler, Beloit's outstanding senior running back, took the opening kickoff to the Norton 21 but the Blue Jays held on their 16 and drove 84 yards for their first touchdown on a 1 yard plunge by senior fullback Matt Stanley. Sophomore Caleb Laughlin's extra point kick was wide but Norton led 6-0 with 4:21 left in the first period.

Sophomore tailback Terrell Lane, who gained 60 yards in the first half and was on track for another 100 plus yards game with his powerful running, scored the Blue Jays' second touchdown from 25 yards out with 11:38 remaining in the second quarter. Junior quarterback Conner Pfannenstiel passed to junior tight end J.D. Gall for 2 points and the fired up Blue Jays were on top 14-0.

The Trojans answered this time with a 22 yard touchdown run by Spangler with 9:28 left in the first half. A run for the 2 extra points made it 14-8. A 27 yard field goal by Norton's Laughlin extended the Blue Jay lead to 17-8 with 6:25 left. Again, Beloit answered as Spangler ran 30 yards for a touchdown with 2:10 left.

Norton's Lane was injured on the play and had to watch the rest of the game from the sidelines.

After an exchange of possessions, Beloit had the ball on their 10 but Spangler got loose for a 90 yard touchdown run to put the Trojans ahead 20-17 with 1:24 left in the third quarter. After Beloit intercepted a Norton pass on their 35, Beloit senior running back Jordan File found an opening in the Blue Jay defense and sprinted 65 yards for another Beloit touchdown with 11:50 left in the game, extending their lead to 26-17. After another exchange of possessions, Beloit intercepted another pass and junior running back Logan Eck ran 28 yards for the Trojans' final touchdown and added 2 extra points to make the score 34-17 with 7:27 left. A final Norton drive was halted by another pass interception.

The Blue Jays completed their excellent season with an 8-3 record. Norton defeated previously unbeaten Scott City and St. Francis and came within two points of handing Smith Center their first loss in five seasons!

Beloit (10-1) will continue on to play Conway Springs (9-2) this Friday in Sectional competition.

Terrell Lane was Norton's leading rusher, despite playing in just the first half. He gained 60 yards on 14 carries for a 4.3 yard average. He was followed by: Matt Stanley, 9 for 39, 4.3 average; Connor Pfannenstiel, 7 for 28, 4.3 average; Landon Hamel, 5 for 17, 3.4 average and Zane Perez, 6 for 6.

Pfannenstiel completed 8 of 20 passes for 40 percent and 125 yards. His receivers were: Landon Hamel, 3 for 80, 26.6 average; age; Matt Stanley, 1 for 17; J.D. Gall, 2 for 16, 8 average.



in the second half," said coach Melvin. "We didn't keep the ball away from them with sustained drives like in the first half.

"Defensively, we didn't make plays in the second half; we just didn't tackle well enough."

The Blue Jays were not as effective at mixing passes with runs in the second half. Coach Melvin pointed out that Pfannenstiel completed five of his first five passes but was only 3 of his last 13 when he had trouble gripping the ball in the cold weather.

"We hit real hard just like we did all season," said coach Melvin. "We have a lot to be proud of. We expected to win and could have if we had made a couple of more plays.

"We had a good season and probably exceeded a lot of people's expectations.

"I especially thank our senior players for their leadership and hard play. I hope our younger players will step up and start working hard for next season. I encourage

Leading rusher for Beloit was Spangler with 218 yards on 24 attempts. Spangler had 142 yards on his three touchdown runs. On his other 21 tries, the Norton defense limited the explosive Trojan to an average of just 3.6 yards per carry.
