

# No end in sight

Johnson. "Smith Center is the defending 3-2-1A state champion and tied with Beloit for the state championship the year before. Beloit placed third in the state last year.

"Scott City is ranked No. 4 in the state in Class 4A this year and Mill Valley is ranked tenth in the state in Class 5A.

"We have some good wrestlers but we also have a number of injuries. That will give some of our wrestlers an opportunity to step up.

"It will also be good for our junior varsity wrestlers to compete in this tough varsity tournament."

Norton is the defending tournament champion, having won it the past five years. When Norton won the title in 2003-04, it broke a Hoxie winning streak of seven straight championships.

### Former wrestler honorees

Norton Community High School has a long and rich wrestling tradition. Since beginning wrestling in 1931, NCHS has crowned nine state championship teams, 84 individual champions and a total of 254 individual state medalists.

Being honored from the 1939 team, which placed tenth in the state, will be Everett Amos Mason, who was second at 103 pounds. He is deceased.

The 1949 team placed seventh in the state. Being honored will be Don Strevey, champion, 165, Omaha, Neb.; Harold Waufle, third, 120, deceased; Dwight Johnson, third, 154, Minneapolis, Minn.; coach Paul Casper, deceased.

The 1959 team was the first of six state championship Norton teams coached by coach Jake Durham. State medalists from

the team who will be honored are: Alvin Bird, champion, 154, Winfield; Rex Stephenson, second, 95, Seal Rock, Ore.; Larry Taylor, second, 103, Perryton, Tex.; Jim Kent, second, 127, Saint Joe, Ark.; Bob Balinger, third, 133, Glenwood Springs, Colo.

The 1969 Blue Jay wrestling team placed third in the state in 3-2-1A and was coached by Jake Durham. Being honored will be medalists: Roger Fisher, champion, 95, Jamestown, N.D.; Quinten Horning, champion, 138, Mulvane; Tom Ankenman, third, 112, Hutchinson; Ralph Hackney, third, 165, Hays.

Norton's 1979 squad placed second in the state in Class 4A and was also coached by Jake Durham. Medalists to be honored are: Kyle Hahn, champion, 119, Ness City; Mike Ray, champion, 132, Springfield, Va; James Durham, second, 145, Kansas City, Kans.; Kurt Hahn, third, 98, Wichita; J.D. Higgason, third, 105, Kansas City, Mo.; Mike Jimenez, third, 155, Fresno, Calif.

Being honored from the 1989 team will be Chris Harting, third, 171, Norton and Kendall Hahn, fourth, 130, Omaha, Neb.. It was the last Norton team coached by Jake Durham.

Honorees from the 1999 squad will be J.B. Harding, champion, 103, Hays and Shawn O'Toole, third, 112, Carrollton, Ga.

Norton's honored state medalists and families will first meet at 4 p.m. in Room 143 at Norton Community High School for fellowship and light refreshments.

Around 5 p.m., the former state medalists from Norton will be introduced to the crowd at the tournament. Each will receive a certificate of wrestling excellence from J.R. "Jake" Durham in honor of the anniversary of their state medal.

A reception will be held after the finals in the school cafeteria. The public is encouraged to attend and meet the former wrestlers and their families.

Admission to the entire tournament is \$6 for adults and \$5 for students.

Admission to session No. 2 only is \$3 for kindergarten through adults. Pre-school children are admitted free.

council meeting.

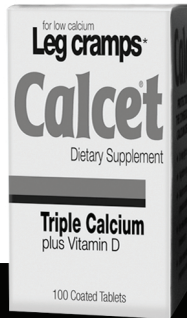
The council went into executive session for 40 minutes. There was no action taken as a result of the executive session when the council returned to open meeting.
