Lady Blue Jays bring home 77-25 victory

one of those nights on Tuesday when everything went right and, unfortunately for the Lady Red Devils from Oberlin, it happened on their home court.

In a trip outside the Mid-Continent League, the Lady Blue Jays traveled to Oberlin to play their long-time rival from the Northwest Kansas League.

From the opening whistle, Norton's game was clicking on all cylinders as the Lady Jays ran up a 30-6 first quarter lead en route to a 77-25 victory.

Without the reserves playing the final quarter and a half and the continuous clock after a 30 point lead at the start of the fourth quarter, the final margin of victory could have been larger.

"We played very well tonight," said Norton head coach Kevin

"Offensively, we got off to a great start and played well all night long. "On defense, it was another

great effort by our girls. "It was nice we were able to play

a lot of girls and a lot of different combinations.

Bozarth was also on target for the game, hitting a red hot 8 of 9 from the field for 89 percent and 2 of 4 free throws for 18 points!

Leading scorer for Oberlin was Erin Jones with 7 points.

Norton's team shooting average was also tremendous. The Lady Jays swished 4 of 8 from beyond the arc for 50 percent, 27 of 42 two-point tries for 64 percent and 31 of 50 overall for 62 percent!

Meanwhile, Oberlin hit 1 of 7 three-point tries for 14 percent, 10 of 33 two-point attempts for 30 percent and 11 of 40 overall for 28 percent.

From the free throw line, Norton swished 11 of 20 for 55 percent and Twenty-three more points were the Lady Red Devils connected on least one of Norton's 22 offensive

After falling behind 18-2 after in the contest. one quarter and 32-8 by halftime, Norton played much better in the second half where they beat the Red Devils 18-16 in the third quarter and 15-14 in the fourth period to outscore Oberlin 33-30 in the second half.

The first half deficit was just too much for the inexperienced Norton quintet to overcome after intermission against the veteran Oberlin five. Only three Blue Jay lettermen returned this season and none were starters.

Landon Hamel led Norton is scoring and hit the Jays' only first quarter basket. Ashton Draper swished two baskets and Dakota Dreher hit another for Norton in the second quarter.
