

Husky Ladies perfect in conference

The Lady Huskies played the Palco Roosters in their last regular season and home game of the season. They came away with a 59-23 victory that gave them an undefeated conference slate to go along with their conference tournament earlier in the year.

"Our team tries to learn from each contest whether we win or don't. The lesson taught to us by the Lady Roosters was this: Fear no one and play as hard as you can each and every play of each and every game; whatever happens then happens but you can feel good about your effort," said coach Chuck Zimmerman.

"For us, we started off fairly slow but adjusted to their efforts and finally our defense started to get steals and converted them into baskets as we finished the opening quarter with a 22-2 margin.

"We played all our squad in this game as some of our younger sisters received some valuable game experience against a varsity team and to their credit did very well defensively. Matter of fact the younger teammates held their counterparts to only one point in the fourth quarter. Quite an improvement from the start of the season," he said.

"Defense played a huge role in this victory as deflects and steals got our offense going. Our deflects leader was Alison Cole with 5 (3 blocks) while Christina Anderson had 4 with Karen Wenzl and Megan Cole with 3 each," he said.

Steals were taken by Anderson with 4 while Staci Dole took 3. Rebounds were grabbed by M. Cole with 5 while A. Cole, Anderson and Brittney Braun each pulled down 4. Assists were handed out by Anderson with 4 with Braun

finding 3 teammates open for scores.

"A good ending to a successful regular season. We finished with a 12-6 (13-6 counting Phillipsburg JV game) record. Winning the conference tournament for the second year in a row and winning the conference regular season title going undefeated," coach Zimmerman said.

"We now start the post season where we are seeded second in our regional," he said.

"We want to thank the fans for their support during the season so far and hope you will continue to follow us as we hope to equal if not better last season's efforts," coach Zimmerman concluded.

A citizen of the United States who is 18 years of age or older, or will have attained the age of 18 years at the next election, must register before he or she can vote. Registration closes 14 days prior to every election.

When a registered voter changes residence from one precinct to another precinct, such voter must re-register in order to be eligible to vote. Any person may apply in person, by telephone, or by mail to the county election officer to be registered. Application forms shall be provided by the county election officer upon request by the applicant. Such application shall be signed by the applicant under penalty of perjury.

When a registered voter fails to vote in two consecutive general elections, such voter's name may be removed from the registration books and party affiliation lists. Such voter must re-register in order to be eligible to vote.

Northern Valley's varsity boys basketball team picked up a 59-57 win over Palco at home Friday night.

The Roosters took a 3-point, 18-15 lead at the end of the first quarter, and the Huskies responded in the second with a 19-point outburst to lead at intermission 34-31.

The second half was a nail-biter with the Huskies holding a 1-point edge at the buzzer 41-40. The final quarter saw Northern Valley outscore the Roosters 18-17 to claim the win!

Eric Woodside led the Northern Valley charge with 19 big points. Also scoring in double figures was Colton Lowry with 11. Adding to the total were Dusty Eagleburger with 7; Ethan Hays 5; Chaim McMillin 6; Cody Callaway 6; and Drew Eagleburger 5.

The Huskies scored on 18 2-pointers, 6 from 3-point range and 5 from the free throw line.

Newell was tops for Palco with 19 points. As a team, the Roosters scored on 19 2-pointers, 33-pointers and 10 charity tosses.

The Northern Valley varsity basketball Huskies were unable to derail the Ellis Railroads last Thursday night, suffering a 65-49 setback at home.

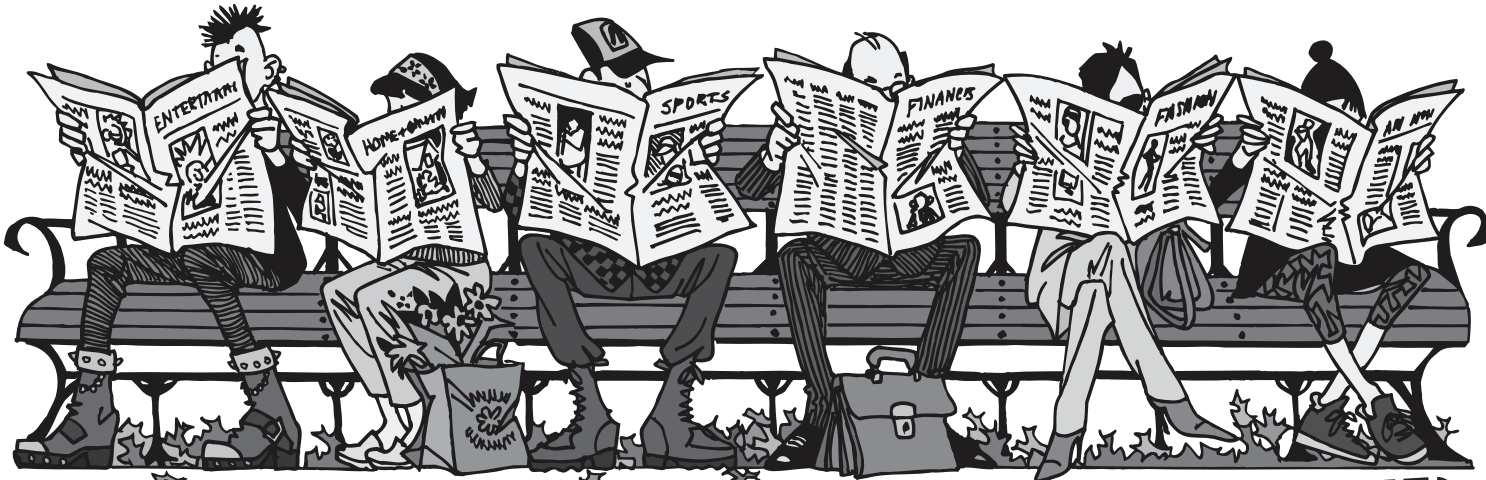
