Norton Blue Jay girls roll to 51-14 victory

The Norton Community High School girls varsity basketball team had lots of extra reasons to want to defeat Plainville in a rare Monday game in the NCHS Stull Gym and they did so by outscoring the Lady Cardinals 51-14.

After losing a two-point game to Ellis on Friday night, Norton needed a win over Plainville in this final league game of the season to ensure at least a tie for the Mid-Continent League championship. On top of that, it was "Senior Night" for six Norton girls.

The Lady Jays did not disappoint their loyal fans as they jumped out to a 19-4 first quarter lead, added 19 more points in the second quarter to take a 38-6 halftime advantage and scored 13 more points in the third period to extend their lead to 51-14.

Neither team scored in the timeshortened fourth quarter during which the scoreboard clock ran continuously since Norton led by more than 30 points at the start of the quarter. The Norton reserves played the fourth quarter.

Laura Lee Baird hit two threepoint shots and a two-pointer, Katharine Roy buried a trey, Lacey Wallingford and Hayli Bozarth each hit two baskets in the first quarter.

Bozarth added three more twopoint baskets, Baird hit two more. Ashlie Stewart hit a shot from hit 6 of 38 two-point shots for 16 beyond the arc and a two-pointer and Roy and Amanda Ray each hit baskets for the Lady Jays in the second quarter.

Making Norton's 13 third quarter points were Baird with a trey and two-point basket, Bozarth with a basket and three free throws, Stewart with another basket and KaraJo Jones with a free throw.

"It's nice to get back to winning," said Norton head girls

coach Kevin Jilka.

"We played with more energy tonight and got off to a good start. We were playing good defense and got some steals and easy baskets at the start of the game.

"This was a nice way for our seniors to go out in their last regular season home game."

The Norton seniors and their parents were honored with a special ceremony prior to the game. Lady Jay senior players are: Lacey Wallingford, Katharine Roy, Taylor Rossi, Laura Lee Baird, KaraJo Jones and Hayli Bozarth.

Student manager Hannah Fulton and cheerleader Kayla Scheetz, both seniors, were also honored.

Taylor Rossi received a seasonending injury earlier in the year. Baird was leading scorer for Norton with 17 points and Bozarth hit 15. Kylee Pywell and Amanda Carey each scored 4 points for the Lady Cardinals.

Baird hit 3 of 5 shots from beyond the arc for 60 percent, 4 of 8 two-point attempts for 50 percent and 7 of 13 overall for 54 percent accuracy. Bozarth connected on 6 of 17 two-point tries for 35 percent and was 3 of 4 from the charity stripe for 75 percent.

16 three-point shots for 31 percent, 16 of 48 two-point tries for 33 percent and 21 of 64 overall for 33 percent.

Plainville missed all 8 trey tries, percent and was 6 of 46 overall for 13 percent.

From the free throw line, Norton connected on 4 of 8 for 50 percent and Plainville swished 2 of 8 for 25 percent.

The Lady Jays outrebounded the Lady Cardinals 38-26. Norton had 12 offensive and 26 defensive caroms and Plainville pulled down 7 offensive and 19 defensive boards.

Norton had 14 steals and Plainville had 7. Stewart was the leader with 4, followed by Wallingford, Waggoner, Baird, Bozarth, 2 each; Roy, KaraJo Jones, 1 each.

The Lady Jays recorded 8 offensive assists compared to 4 for the Lady Cardinals. Stewart led with 3, followed by KaraJo Jones, 2; Wallingford, Baird, Bozarth, 1 each.

Norton had just 11 turnovers and Plainville lost the ball 20 times.
