Right of way hay permits now available

The Kansas Department of Transportation said permits will be issued to harvest hay on Kansas highway right of way.

Permit applications are available at any department of transportation office or on the department's Web site at <http://www.ksdot.org/offtransinfo/Form317.pdf> and are good for one year or a specific haying season. Access to any right of way shall be determined by the department of transportation.

Applicants must secure the signature of the county weed director prior to submitting the form for approval with the department of transportation. Also, a change this year is that mile post locations are now necessary on the permit form instead of the section lines to identify the area being requested to

harvest hay.

Those with land adjacent to the right of way will be given permit priority from Jan. 1 until March 31 of each year. After March 31, permits to harvest will be issued in the order in which they are received.

Permits can be canceled at any time by either party and all operations shall be in accord with requirements and guidelines set by the department.

Any person, firm or corporation wanting to mow or bale hay will need to submit a permit application to the department of transportation office in their area.
