Terri's group had two 7 year olds traveling with their parents and many teens in the group traveling on their own, so they were placed at a new work area at Puerto Penasco, on the northeast end of the Gulf of California. After traveling 25 hours by bus, they completed construction on a new chapel and 2 new homes in 3 days. The smaller home for a family of 5 also included building a new 'banos' (outhouse) and buying the family a new commode to upgrade from just a hole in the ground. The larger home consisted of a 4 room structure for a family of 8.

The day after finishing construction on the houses, the group

traveled from the very poor slum area to the luxury beach resort of Rocky Point, just 10 miles away. There they enjoyed a day of relaxing on the beach, swimming in the clear water and exploring the shopping district. The group was amazed to discover that one night in some hotels on the beach cost three times more than the families they built for earned in a month. The group enjoyed great weather all week and encountered many kind and helpful locals in Puerto Penasco. They returned home early in the morning on March 21, already making plans for next year's mission trip.
