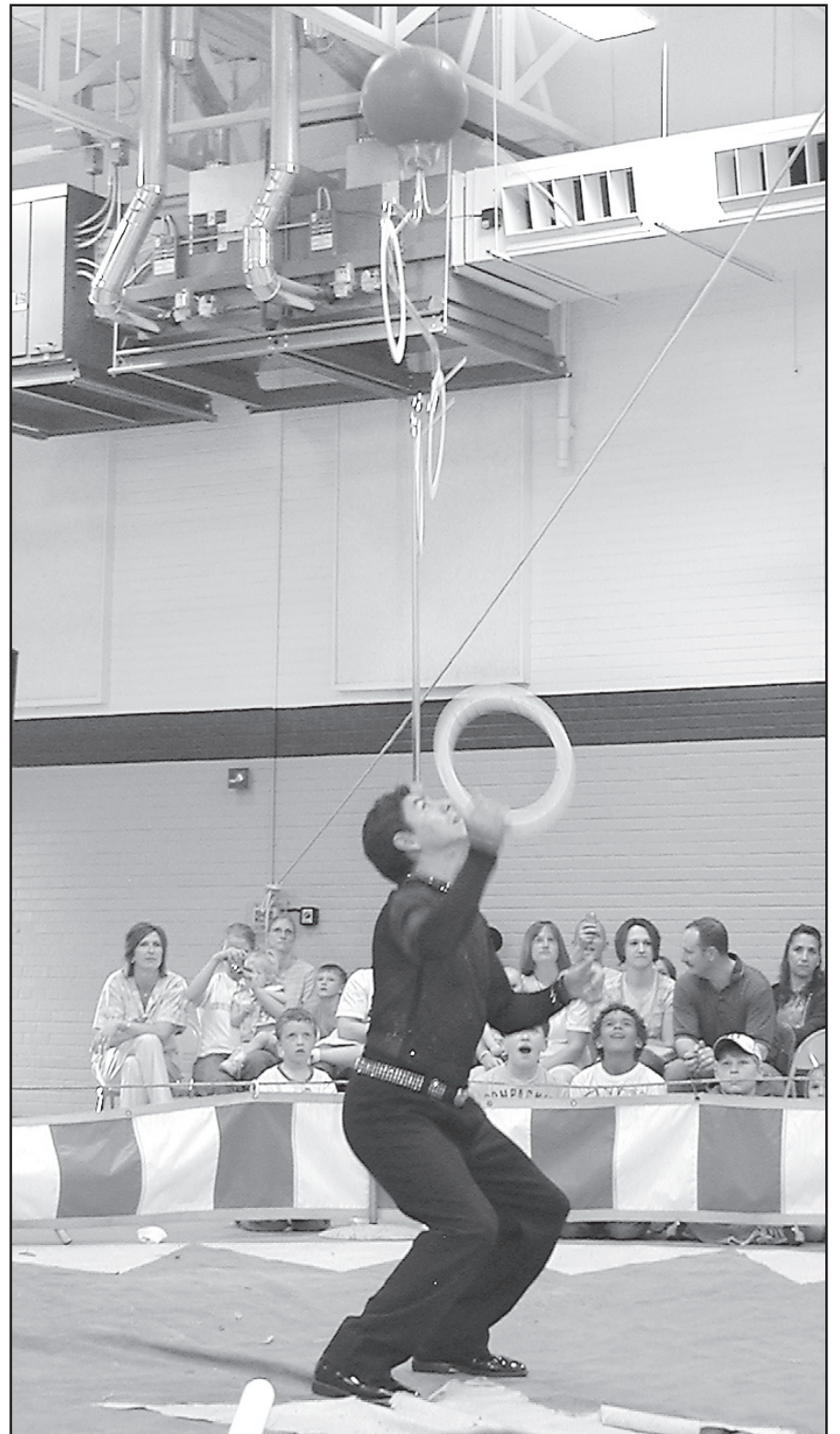

There was something for everyone — "age-friendly," as one person described it. Circuses, although more cozy with metropolitan crowds, are still a hit when they stop in smaller communities.

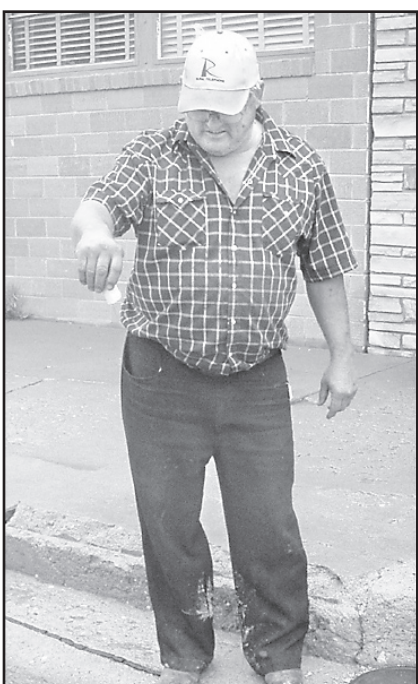

Norton big winner at drafting fair

Norton Community High School's presence was felt in a big way at the Northwest Kansas Technical College's Drafting Fair at Goodland.

Norton took the top spot with Hays High and Oberlin, second and third, respectively.

And it's important to emphasize that Norton took first as a team for the fifth straight year!

And on top of all of that, Troy Bainter was the grand champion, best drawing at the contest. For that accomplishment, he pockets a \$1,000 scholarship to the Northwest Kansas Technical College. "That's quite an honor," Jim Myers, instructor, said.

"I have some talented drafting kids. I am proud of them. They take real pride in their work and it shows," he said.

Mr. Myers reports that Zac Dreher and Adam Myers placed in four events, while Hannah Fulton and Cody Cook placed in three events to score solid points for the team.

Norton won five of the eight categories. First place finishers were seniors Zac Dreher and Hannah Fulton, junior Adam Myers and sophomores Troy Bainter and John Koch.

The next competition will be April 30-May 1 at Fort Hays State University's Technology Fair in Hays.

Counties united in plea for disability funding

County commissioners from across the 18 counties of northwest Kansas, including Norton, have overwhelmingly endorsed a resolution to the Kansas Legislature to support legislation for multi-year funding for community-based

services for persons with developmental disabilities. This unique multi-county resolution is being presented to each of the legislators who represent the 18-county area with the message to support House Bill 2094 and Senate Bill 207.

The resolution states, "Therefore, be it resolved: That the County Commissioners do hereby express the urgency of this matter and request the Kansas Legislature to adequately fund commu- (Continued on Page 5)
