Blue Jays go 2-3 in Plainville Invitational

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Competing in 80 degree temperatures with little wind, the best conditions so far this season, the Norton Community High School girls track and field team finished runner-up and the Blue Jay boys thinclads placed third in the annual Plainville Invitational Track Meet on Tuesday in Plainville.

Ellis won the girls championship with 139 points, followed by Norton, 109; Victoria, 105; Plainville, 86; Trego Community, 68.5; La Crosse, 46; Phillipsburg, 23.5.

The boys champion was La Crosse with 144 points, followed by Victoria, 142; Norton, 119; Plainville, 79; Trego Community, 47; Ellis, 43; Phillipsburg, 1.

Norton did exceptionally well considering that neither the girls nor the boys had complete squads due to a limit to how many meets athletes may compete in during a season.

"In the third varsity meet of the season, our athletes had an awesome day!" said Norton head track and field coach Jason Jones.

"We did not take a full squad on either side and we had some athletes out of their normal positions so we are overly pleased with these team results.

"Times and distances are a little tough to compare to previous performances due to the weather that we have seen up until now but we did post new personal records in a number of areas on both sides and we had some seasonal best performances. That is where we want to be at this point.

"We are very proud of the effort that our athletes are giving and we continue to be pleased with the results that they are posting! We plan to continue working to improve."

GIRLS

The Norton girls set seven personal records en route to their runner-up finish.

Two of the personal bests resulted in gold medals. Junior Bethany Roy threw the javelin a personal record distance of 111'6" to win that event and sophomore Dustyna Sprigg triple jumped 31'2" to earn

Lady Jay junior Hannah Waggoner earned a bronze medal in the 200 meter dash with a time of 26.71 and placed fourth in the 100 meter dash in 12.85.

Junior Alyssa Thomson earned the bronze medal in the high jump with a clearance of 4'8". Also winning bronze medals were members of Norton's 4 x 400 meter relay team which was timed in 4:37.43. Members of the foursome were Waggoner, Sprigg, junior Kendra Engelbert and Sady Keilig.

Sady Keilig set a personal record in the long jump with a leap meter dash.

Twelve personal records were set by the Norton boys during their competition.Three individuals and one relay won gold medals for the Blue Jays.

Senior Zac Dreher earned the gold in the javelin with a throw of 145'4" and sophomore brother Dakota Dreher matched him with a gold in the high jump with a personal best clearance of 5'10".

Junior Ashton Draper hit the finish line first in the 400 meter dash with a time of 52.96.

The Norton 4 x 400 meter relay team of senior Brock Lauer, freshman Tye Nickell, Dakota Dreher and Draper earned gold medals with a time of 3:47.48.

Draper also placed second in the 200 meter dash in a personal record time of 24.19 and Lauer

finished right behind him in third timed in 2:23.09 to place sixth. with a personal record time of 24.21.

Senior Jordan Bebb heaved the shot 43'3.75", a personal best, to earn the silver medal.

Freshman Seth Antrim cleared 11' in the pole vault to place second. Nickell finished third with a personal best clearance of 10' and junior Casey Robison was fourth with a 9' clearance.

Lauer also captured the bronze medal in the 100 meter dash with a personal best time of 11.81.

Freshman Zach Hartwell won bronze medals with personal records in both the 1600 and 3200 meter races. Hartwell was timed in 5:10.53 in the 1600 meters and in 11:32.84 in the 3200 meters.

Sophomore Troy Bainter had two fourth place finishes to his credit. He was timed in 2:18.87 in the 800 meter run and in a personal record time of 5:19.87 in the 1600 meter run.

Sophomore Ryan Blecha placed second in the 100 meter dash with a personal best time of 12.18 and third in the shot put with a heave

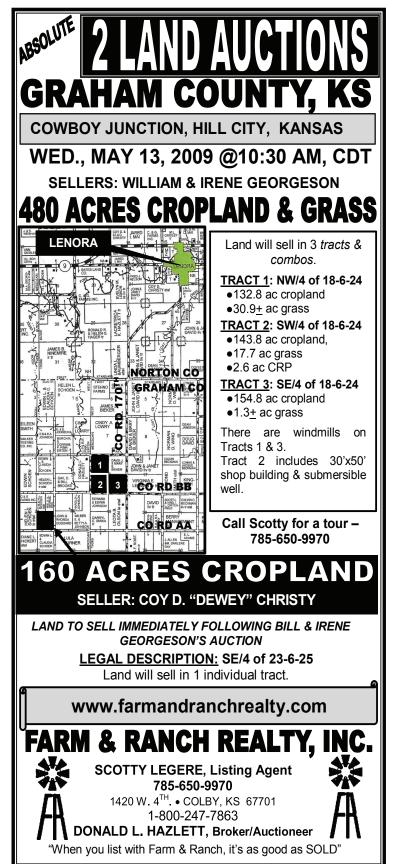
