
A day in Logan

Steps could save credit

cost Americans \$1.5 billion. Norton County Undersheriff Rich Wenzl attended a class Aug. 4 in Salina regarding the steps that

need to be taken after someone suspects their identity has been stolen. He said step one is to place a fraud alert on your credit report

by contacting one of the credit reporting companies. One company will notify the

The companies are Equifax,

Experian or Trans Union. Mr. Wenzl said step two is to close compromised accounts by

calling all companies where an account has been tampered with. He suggested following up with a certified letter to the company so that there would be a record of the

account being closed. The third step is to report the identity theft to the Federal Trade Commission by completing an online complaint form.

The undersheriff said the fourth step is to file a police report and get a report for your records.

"The purpose of all of this is to fix your credit rating at the end," he said.

He said the card does not need to be stolen; just the information which could happen anywhere, especially when traveling.

"If you notice it when you get into Norton, come in and report it. But, if you notice it in Denver, report it there," he said.

He said a suspect could ruin someone's credit within a few

"I think the biggest thing to do to prevent identity theft is to check your credit rating once a year," he said.

Mr. Wenzl said there is a difference between identity theft and fraud, although both should be reported.

He said an example of fraud would be cashing an unknown check from another country.



HEALTH PROFILE CONTAINS: Electrolytes - (Sodium, potassium, chloride and total carbon dioxide) These are major indicators of kidney and hormonal functions. Electrolytes are essential for the body's acid-base balance and the

operation of nerves and muscles, especially the heart. **Kidney Functions** - (BUN, creatinine) These indicators are used to monitor kidney function. Liver Functions - (Total albumin, globulin) These tests can be used in detecting and/or monitoring

liver function damage, tissue damage or inflammation. Alkaline Phosphate - (Uric acid, calcium, phosphorus) Used for detection and monitoring of bone,

tissue and parathyroid disease, such as arthritis, gout, bursitis and lupus. Glucose - This test is to measure blood sugar levels and is used to help diagnose/monitor diabetes

Cholesterol - (Including HDL, LDL, VLDL, triglycerides and ratio of LDL/HDL) these are fats produced in the liver that combine with fatty oils in the blood stream. Cholesterol is further broken down and measured as HDL (good cholesterol) and LDL (bad cholesterol). The person who has higher levels of LDL is at greater risk of heart disease. Triglycerides determine the level of simple fats in the blood. **CBC** - (Complete blood count with differential) This is a series of tests of the blood that provides a tremendous amount of information about the hematogolic system, immune response and many other

Profile #2 (PSA)\$20.00 PSA - This test detects an enlarged prostate, infected prostate and/or prostatic cancer. It can be used to evaluate disease progression and to monitor treatment.

TSH - This test is used to evaluate thyroid function and detect if there is too much or too little hor-
