AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PUBLIC OFFENSES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF ALMENA, KANSAS; INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE "UNIFORM PUBLIC OFFENSE CODE FOR KANSAS CITIES," EDITION OF 2009
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ALMENA, KANSAS:

SECTION ONE. INCORPORATING UNIFORM PUBLIC OFFENSE CODE. There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating public offenses within the corporate limits of the City of Almena, Kansas, that certain code known as the "Uniform Public Offense Code," Edition of 2009, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas. No fewer than two (2) copies of said Uniform Public Offense Code shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 419," and to which shall be attached a copy of this ordinance, and filed with the City Clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable hours.

SECTION TWO. AMENDMENT. Section 11-101 of the Almena City Code is hereby amended and replaced by Section One of this ordinance.

SECTION THREE. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official City newspaper.

ORDINANCE NO. 418
AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF ALMENA, KANSAS; INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE "STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE FOR KANSAS CITIES," EDITION OF 2009, PROVIDING CERTAIN PENALTIES AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 409
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ALMENA, KANSAS:

SECTION ONE. INCORPORATING STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE. There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating traffic within the corporate limits of the City of Almena, Kansas, that certain standard traffic ordinance known as the "Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities," Edition of 2009, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas. No fewer than two (2) copies of said Standard Traffic Ordinance shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 418," and to which shall be attached a copy of this ordinance, and filed with the City Clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable hours.

The Police Department, Municipal Judge and all administrative departments of the City charged with enforcement of the ordinance shall be supplied, at the cost of the City such number of official copies of such Standard Traffic Ordinance similarly marked, as may be deemed expedient.
SECTION TWO. TRAFFIC INFRACTIONS AND TRAFFIC OFFENSES.
a.) An ordinance traffic infraction is a violation of any section of this ordinance that prescribes or requires the same behavior as that prescribed or required by a statutory provision that is classified as a traffic infraction in K.S.A. 8-2118.
b.) All traffic violations which are included within this ordinance, and which are not ordinance traffic infractions, as defined in subsection (a) of this section, shall be considered traffic offenses.
SECTION THREE. PENALTY FOR SCHEDULED FINES. The fine for violation of an ordinance traffic infraction or any other traffic offense for which the Municipal Judge establishes a fine in a fine schedule shall not be less than \$1, nor more than \$500, except for speeding, which shall not be less than \$20, nor more than \$500. A person tried and convicted for violation of an ordinance traffic infraction or other traffic offense for which a fine has been established in a schedule of fines shall pay a fine fixed by the Court not to exceed \$500.
SECTION FOUR. REPEAL. Ordinance number 409 is repealed.
SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official City newspaper.

CHARTER ORDINANCE NO. 11

CHARTER ORDINANCE NO. 11
A CHARTER ORDINANCE EXEMPTING THE CITY OF NORTON, KANSAS FROM THE PROVISIONS OF K.S.A. 14-201 ONLY AS IT RELATES TO SPECIFICATION OF CERTAIN SALARIES BY ORDINANCE, AND PROVIDING SUBSTITUTE AND ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS ON THE SAME SUBJECT NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF NORTON, KANSAS:

Section 1: That the City of Norton, Kansas by power vested in it by Article 12, Section 5 of the Constitution of the State of Kansas, hereby elects to exempt itself from and make inapplicable to it certain provisions of K.S.A. 14-201 relating to the establishment of the salaries of the Municipal Judge, the Police Chief, the City Clerk, the City Attorney, and City Police Officers by Ordinance and hereby providing substitute and additional provisions as set forth herein. Such referenced statute is applicable to this City but not uniformly applicable to all cities.

Section 2: That the substitute and additional provisions shall provide that the salaries of the Municipal Judge, the Police Chief, The City Clerk, the City Attorney and City Police Officers shall be established by adoption of an annual Resolution or by establishment of Pay Ranges and Pay Scales as adopted in the annual City of Norton Employee Handbook and any amendments or additions thereto.

Section 3: That this ordinance shall be published once a week for two consecutive weeks in the Norton Telegram, the official City Newspaper.
Section 4: That this is a Charter Ordinance and shall take effect sixty-one (61) days after its final publication unless within 60 days of its final publication a Petition signed by a number of electors of the City of Norton, Kansas equal to not less than ten percent of the number of electors who voted at the last preceding regular city election shall be filed in the Office of the City Clerk of Norton, Kansas demanding an election on the Charter Ordinance, in which case the Charter Ordinance shall become effective only if and when approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon.
